The ASSC will host a CORA Drive Contest all month long in April, in collaboration with Community Overcoming Relationship Abuse (CORA) of San Mateo and in honor of Sexual Assault Awareness Month.

CONTEST DETAILS

Three clubs will be awarded three credits to their club account at the end of the contest, in the following denominations.

First Place \$300 Second Place \$200 Third Place \$100

- In order to be eligible for the prizes, the club must raise a minimum of 50 items.
- Items must match the Wish List that ASSC provides, in order to count for the contest.
- Items must be new, store-bought and in good condition.
- The ASSC will reserve the right to determine if an item will count towards the contest and determine the clubs eligibility for prizes. Clubs must be in good standing.
- Disbursement of prizes will occur in May, at the discretion of the ASSC.
- Organizations are not eligible for prizes.

The Skyline College Veterans Club is requesting 500 dollars from SOC so the Veterans Club can donate money to The Wall That Heals. The Wall that Heals in an event at Golden Gate National Cemetery to honor the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War. The Avenue of the Flags is bringing the Vietnam Memorial Wall to the Golden Gate National Cemetery. The wall where be here from April 9th to 12. Overall the purpose of this event is to show support to Veteran organization as well of honor those Veterans who of the Vietnam War.



SACNAS (Society for the Advancement of Chicanos/Hispanics and Native Americans in Science) is a nation-wide organization dedicated to the representation of Hispanics, Native Americans, and all other underrepresented minorities in the scientific profession. As of 2010, a survey conducted by the National Science Foundation reported that people of Hispanic, African American, and "other race" collectively represent 13% of the scientific community; a community that makes decisions that affects the modern world. To promote those who fit the demographic and are pursuing a major in a scientific field, the Skyline SACNAS Chapter hopes to offer two scholarships to be offered on the Skyline campus.

We plan to offer one \$250 scholarship, and one \$550 scholarship. The scholarships will be awarded based off the following criteria:

- 1. Academic Merit the student must have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- 2. Personal goals for their career and why they want to become part of the scientific community, to be determined by an essay, which will be read and judged by both the chapter officers and professors willing to give their time.
 - a. NOTE: Members of SACNAS will be eligible to apply for the scholarship, but being a member will not affect the candidate's chances of winning the scholarship in any way.

For these reasons, we request a sum of \$500 from SOCC.

- Of that \$500, \$250 will be put aside to guarantee the first scholarship.
- The remaining \$250 will be put towards fundraising efforts to obtain the \$550 needed for the second scholarship.

To fundraise the needed \$550 before the fall semester of 2015, we plan on:

- 1. Holding T-Shirt sales and raffles on campus.
 - a. T-Shirts will be designed and voted on by the Chapter members, ordered online via Customink.com. Any raffle prizes will either be donated from supporting members or local stores. If no donations are obtained, some of the \$250 will be put towards purchasing prizes, with members donating to fill in any holes left over.
- 2. Hosting nature walks, cultural events, and environmental events.
 - a. SACNAS also aims to bring awareness to the Chicano/Native American cultures, and to bring awareness to the environment, both of which will be turned into events to be held on and off campus for the Skyline community. They will either be paid events, or events with suggested donations.
- 3. Partaking in on-campus and off-campus sales.
 - a. We also plan on selling items from fundraising companies on and off campus along with our other plans.
- 4. Having internal Chapter payment and donations.
 - a. Lastly, we hope that members of the Chapter and students on campus will donate to the fundraising of the scholarship.

In the event that the total sum of \$550 isn't met, whatever profit made will either be offered in place of the \$550 scholarship, or will be divided into smaller scholarships to be offered. This will be determined by a chapter vote should this event occur.

Ultimately, we hope that this scholarship, and all the events that it entails, will increase awareness to the goals of SACNAS and will increase both an interest in the scientific field of study and an interest in joining SACNAS to help with future events, possibly making this scholarship a regular occurrence on this campus.
