DANCE presented the CPR at Curriculum on Wednesday, including our updated degree format, which streamlines our degree and removes obstacles to graduation.

#### **Full Description**

New degree updated which reflects the priorities of the SC Promise Load in Dance has increased by 7% while college-wide average has decreased by 12% Success rates at 80%

Withdrawal rates equivalent across cohorts, equivalent with college averages We seek funding to institutionalize our Dance Festival and Competitive Dance Teams, to regularly offer Tap and Hip Hop, and to fund additional guest choreographers in order to expand the diversity which has been stunted by the death of repeatability.

Since our 2012 CPR, we have produced:

- 12 Dance Concerts
- 6 Musical Productions
- 3 Dance Festivals
- Won 3 National Dance Championships
- 5 Performing Arts Showcases
- AA Program ReDesign
