2012 TAG REQUIREMENTS FOR SELECTIVE MAJORS

For the College of Letters and Science TAG, majors in the Biological Science and Economics, as well as Computer Science, BA

- Require completion of specific major preparatory course work (found at www.assist.org)
- ***Majors excluded from TAG include Dance (B.A., B.F.A.), Music (B.M.) and Theatre (B.F.A.)***
- Major preparation articulation agreements including the minimum required community college courses can be found at www.assist.org under the "By Major" agreements between UCSB and California community colleges.
- Students who do not complete all required preparation courses will not be admitted to the selected major and may not be considered for an alternative major.

GPA Requirements for the College of Letters and Science

- Earn an overall minimum 3.20 GPA in all UC transferable course work by the end of Fall 2011
- Earn a minimum 2.0 GPA in all UC transferable coursework in the Fall 2011 semester
- Maintain a minimum overall 3.20 GPA through the end of the Spring 2012 semester
- Earn a minimum 2.0 GPA in all UC transferable coursework in the Spring 2012 semester.

College of Engineering TAG

- The following majors require completion of specific major preparatory coursework: Chemical Engineering (B.S.), Computer Engineering (B.S.), Computer Science (B.S.), Electrical Engineering (B.S.), and Mechanical Engineering (B.S.).
- Complete all required base preparation courses for the intended major by the end of the Spring 2012 semester
- Applicants must also complete three advanced preparation course offered at their community college.
- Students who do not complete all required preparation courses will not be admitted to the selected major and may not be considered for an alternate major.
- Detailed major preparation articulation agreements including the minimum required community college courses can be found at www.assist.org under the "By Major" agreements between UCSB and California Community colleges.
- Students may attend more than one California community college to earn credit for the required major preparation courses if the courses are not offered or if their schedule constrains them from completing major preparation courses at their own campus.
- College of Engineering Depth Requirement: In fulfilling the GE requirements, all students in the College of Engineering are required to complete a depth requirement. Student who wish to satisfy the depth requirement prior to transfer must complete a year long sequence in the history of world civilization, history of western civilization, history of the United States, history of western philosophy, or history of western art. Students may want to choose courses for general education or IGETC that will concurrently satisfy the depth requirement. Students may also complete the depth requirement after transferring.

GPA requirements for the College of Engineering TAG:

- Earn an overall minimum 3.20 GPA in all UC transferable coursework by the end of Fall 2011
- Earn a minimum 2.0 GPA in all UC transferable coursework in the Fall 2011 semester
- Earn an overall minimum 3.20 GPA in all major preparatory coursework by the end of Fall 2011
- Maintain an overall minimum 3.20 GPA in all major preparatory coursework through the end of the Spring 2012
- Earn a minimum 2.0 GPA in all UC transferable coursework in the Spring 2012 semester

Pre-Majors

Certain majors at UCSB require that students complete remaining prerequisite courses with a minimum grade point average at UCSB after transfer to advance to full major status. Major preparation articulation agreements (found online at www.assist.org) include detailed information about the pre-major. Students may contact UCSB academic department advisers to discuss their plans to transfer and get more information about the pre-major.
