IV. Skyline College Scorecard

The draft Skyline College Scorecard is the next iteration of the Balanced Scorecard, an archived annual report showing if Skyline College had met benchmarks connected to the college's goals. However, the metrics listed in the Balanced Scorecard were not very robust or actionable. Thus, it is being replaced by the Skyline College Scorecard.

Much of the data used in the Skyline College Scorecard is generated from the institutional database to support evaluation of the Comprehensive College Redesign. The Scorecard includes cohort-based and non-cohort-based data. The metrics for the cohort-based students, in this case first-time full and part-time students, includes student educational plan (SEP) completion in their first year, transfer level math



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and English completion within the first year, retention rates by term and by year, units earned toward a degree or certificate, and completion of a degree or certificate within three years. Metrics of non-cohort-based students included headcounts of degree and certificate completers, headcounts of UC and CSU transfers, and course completion rates.

REPORT/ DISCUSSION

I. Town Hall Discussion on Critical Thinking ISLO Results

Guests and committee members introduced themselves and broke into four groups. Two groups discussed the Critical Thinking ISLO results, and the other two groups discussed the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) results pertaining to critical thinking. After 20 minutes of group work, participants shuffled into a new group with representatives from each of the earlier four groups to discuss the overall Critical Thinking ISLO results.

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Below are some of the highlighted findings:

- The CCSSE survey
 - Over time, the College has increased opportunities for students to engage in critical thinking oriented tasks.
 - Students may not understand survey items, such as "synthesizing...information," so their response to a given statement may be inaccurate. Students might not know that they were performing the activities/exercises that were being asked.
- Assessment of student work
 - Men, African American, and Hispanic students are among the lower performing. The results suggest that more professional development pertaining to culturally relevant pedagogy is needed.
 - Concern was expressed about results for the "unknown" demographic. For gender, the binary female/male may be problematic. Unfortunately, demographic information is extracted from Banner, so it's limited to what students enter on their CCC Apply application.
 - The results are not widely representative since they are limited to the disciplines that participated in the assessment.
