## Critical and Greative Thinking ISLO Revision Goals

- Collaborated closely with Creative Thinking ad hoc committee
- Expanded approach to, and definition of, "critical thinking" to incorporate creativity
- Used descriptors to outline processual thinking as a developmental process
- Emphasized the exploration of context and development of rhetorical strategies in order to highlight the importance of pre-thinking
- Also emphasized innovation in order to amplify student's agency when it comes to engaging in an intellectual pursuit
