Welcome

President's Remarks

- Currently hiring faculty and staff positions.
- Construction update
 - Building 12 will be available Fall 2019.
 - Building includes space for instruction; Environmental Science classes with classrooms inside and outside.
 - Event space with a capacity of 250. It overlooks Pacific Ocean.
- Building 1
 - Delay of building 1 construction.
 - Increase in the cost of materials, which is one of the causes of the delay.
 - Dr. Stanback Stroud made a recommendation to the Chancellor and Board to hold off on building 1 until we can build the type of building the college had planned.
 - \$40 million dollars short, due to construction cost escalation.
- Digital signs will be installed at the two campus entrances in 2019.
- Construction in parcel A & B – Housing
 - Late Fall 2020 the homes will be available.
 - Faculty and staff housing.
 - District waitlist is approximately 200 people.
 - Thirty employee units will be available.
- Regina's Legacy Celebration
 - Thursday, April 25, 2019 — in the afternoon.
 - Legacy Celebration to honor Dr. Stanback Stroud.
 - Fundraiser for the Promise and Equity Institute.
- Skyline College's 50th Anniversary 2019-2020
 - Gala is tentatively scheduled for November 15, 2019.
 - There will be other celebrations beginning August 2019 through June 2020.
- Infrastructure around Workforce and Economic Development.
 - Services in Career Technical Education.
 - The College has hired job developers in each Meta Major.
 - Establishing a Dean position to lead Workforce and Economic Development.

President's Breakfast 2019 Planning Update

- Breakfast Committee met twice as of today.
- \$125,000 goal to raise from the President's Council of the \$250,000 overall goal.
- Promise scholarship program – messaging changed from a pilot to a fully implemented program. Completion program to provide scholarships to the 2nd year, in addition to the first year.
- Direct support to students costs about \$1800 for the scholarship portion of the program.
- \$1200 is the amount that the Breakfast Committee decided to use to represent a scholarship for one student for one year. This amount will pay for the tuition only.
- Comprehensive support services – books, intensive counseling and other services.

Process of Granting President's Innovation Funds

- Campus employees are eligible to apply for the President's Innovation Fund funds for new and innovative ideas.
- The members of Cabinet meet to review and recommend funding of the projects. The members of Cabinet include the President, Vice President of Student Services, Vice President of Instruction, Vice President of Administrative Services, Director of Community Relations and Marketing and the Chair of the President's Council.
- Once the projects are funded, the College President notifies the recipients.
