Open Forum on plans for the new buildings, entryways and parking: January 31, 2:10 pm, Room 2306

There will be a college wide open forum on January 31 from 2:10-4:10. Kwan Henmi Architects will present their work on the "bridging documents" for future construction at the college. This work will provide the foundation for requests for proposals for Design/Build teams (architects plus builders) to carry out the actual design and construction of the new buildings, entrances and parking for the college. The people who are part of the "building user groups" have been involved in meetings with Kwan Henmi this fall and now they and other members of the college will have a chance to see the whole package and comment on it.

Loop Road Opening

With the construction of our new Bldg 6 and 7A coming to completion, there is no longer any need to keep the Loop Road closed with the swing gates. I want to thank everyone for their patience with putting up with this temporary inconvenience and ask that everyone be extra careful when driving through that area of the Loop Road that was closed off with swing gates for the past two years. We still have a lot of pedestrian traffic making their way back and forth to Pacific Heights. Stop signs have been placed in that area to slow vehicles and all the pedestrian crosswalks and the speed bump have been repainted in an effort to promote safety. This will be a temporary opening of the Loop Road, as we will once again have to close the Loop Road as we near further construction in that area starting about a year from now.

I sent out the Call for Nominations for this year's Skyline Shines awards by email on Monday. Two awards are made annually: one to a member or group of the Skyline employees and one to a member or group from the community. The Call for Nominations for the Skyline Shines Awards has been sent out to all Skyline employees and is being disseminated to the community through

both the president's council and via a press release. The Call for Nominations letter includes the criteria for the awards. The awardees would be those who most help the college live up to the college's values, which are: campus climate, open access, academic excellence, community connection and shared governance. Building 7 health concerns update

The final report has been submitted in response to concerns expressed by faculty regarding the incidence of brain tumors in Building 7. I appreciate your patience as we investigated this matter, but it was important to perform a thorough investigation. The summary report was prepared by Michael Fischman, M.D., M.P.H. and Industrial Hygienist Dan Cox, Ph.D, C.I.H. In addition to the summary report, there are appendices containing:

- Curriculum vitae of the authors
- Northern California Cancer Center report
- Summary report of Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) and IAQ standards and guidelines
- Detailed air sampling reports from Building 7

The health and safety of our employees and students is very important and with the release of these findings it appears that there is no connection between the brain tumors reported and working in Building 7. The full report with detailed appendices is being provided to Building 7 faculty and staff. Skyline shines on civic engagement

Skyline is committed to educate and engage students for a lifetime of active citizenship. One of the institutional Student Learning Outcomes focuses on Global Citizenship. Thomas Ehrlich said a civically responsible individual is someone who "recognizes himself or herself as a member of a larger social fabric, and therefore considers social problems to be at least partly his or her own." The plight of people in underdeveloped countries, religious persecution, and the war in Iraq are some of the issues that affect us all as a global society. The annual Honors Study topic is developed by the Phi Theta Kappa honor society and the National Collegiate Honors Council (represented at Skyline by the Honors Transfer Program). The 2006-08 Honors Study topic is "Gold, Gods, & Glory: The Global Dynamics of Power." The three *G*s are taken from 15th century historical references but they are just as relevant to understanding the dynamics of power today. Three seminars will be held this month on topics of global significance. If you can, engage your classes in discussions about these issues and encourage them to attend the seminars.
