Leary wins scholarship

Please join me in congratulating Mary Anne Leary, Division Assistant for the Social Science and Creative Arts Division, has just won a Legacy scholarship from the International Dermal Institute. The Institute is recognized world-wide for providing the highest quality of hands-on postgraduate work in the Esthetics field. This opportunity is provided to students who have been in the skin care industry for less than one year. Mary Anne graduated from the Esthetics program at Skyline last May and received her state license soon afterwards. The scholarship provides 100 hours of education that can be taken at any of the institute's locations throughout the world. The theme of her application was "Why Professional Skincare is My Passion". Her presentation was a DVD submission telling of her passion for the world of nature and how that passion translates into her love for the healing arts. She is particularly proud of this accomplishment since she is the first recipient of this scholarship from Skyline College.

Results back from new student media preferences survey

During the fall semester of 2006, Skyline College participated in a national study of community college students and their media preferences. Nearly 35,000 students, including 874 students from Skyline, participated in the on-line survey. The survey was designed and conducted by Interact Communications of Onalaska, Wisconsin. The results from the survey were intended to provide colleges with important data on internal communications, college publications, Webpage design and importance, Internet access, lifestyle activities, radio, television and newspaper preferences, and contact preferences. The information will be used to determine strategies appropriate for future marketing and communications to our students and the community, and will be incorporated into discussions on the college's web development and design.
