GEPP reaches new heights—Skyline's Guaranteed Enrollment Priority Program

Our Guaranteed Enrollment Priority Program (GEPP) is a particularly important part of our outreach efforts. This year 286 students participated via four different GEPP sessions.

Each year we continue to make strides to become more effective with the GEPP sessions and this year we implemented many new ideas which made the transition from high school to Skyline College much easier. These included revision of the Skyline high school website, GEPP

registration online, online application workshops at feeder high schools, and pre-registration for the GEPP session. We also moved one of our GEPP sessions from March to June at the request of the high school counselors. In addition, our outreach efforts helped potential concurrent enrollment students better understand the Futures initiative and how to get an early start on their college education. Skyline wins two state grants

The Chancellor's Office of the California Community Colleges has funded two new grants for Skyline College:

- \$398,283 to provide education for employees of Kaiser Permanente and other healthcare facilities. "The Work-Based Upgrade Innovations Project" features a workbased solutions apprenticeship model for the healthcare industry. The project addresses needs for additional Sterile Processing Technicians throughout the Bay Area. Skyline College will customize and deliver its Sterile Processing Technician program for frontline employees including Certified Nurse Assistants and Monitor Technicians to upgrade their skills and fill these positions. These upgrades will provide greater job security and pay, and establish an excellent career ladder strategy for these frontline employees. Kaiser and Skyline will partner with the Shirley Ware Education Center's Joint Employer Education Fund who will provide intensive case management and support for employees to succeed in the program. The Work-Based Upgrade Innovations Project will be funded from June 30, 2007 to June 30 2008. Congratulations to William Watson, the author of the proposal.
- \$589,637 to address one of the most critical challenges in the renewable energy industry: certified installers. The grant will accomplish two things: it provides seed money for the establishment of a renewable energy incubator in San Mateo County. The only other renewable energy incubator is in Sacramento. Secondly, the grant will support career development in the solar energy sector by providing training for incumbent workers to become certified solar installers. Combined, the two objectives of the Renewable Energy grant will ensure that more renewable energy companies are located in San Mateo County thereby bring in an inflow of venture capital funds into the county. In addition, the certified installer program ensures job security, affordable solar energy systems and a new career path throughout the Bay Area. The Renewable Energy Grant, submitted by Skyline College CITD, is in collaboration with several solar energy companies and associations. The project runs from September 11, 2007 to August, 31, 2008. Skyline's Gateway Program looks to the future

Skyline College and the San Mateo County Workforce Investment Board (WIB) hosted a Gateway Program Recruitment Strategy Luncheon on Monday, May 14, 2007. The luncheon featured attendees from Skyline College, San Mateo County (SMC) Workforce Development Unit, SMC Adolescent Services, SMC Jobs for Youth, San Mateo Adult School, The Career Ladders Project, and Opportunities Industrial Centers West - Youth Program. The Gateway Program is a learning community that includes math, English, reading and career development in a specially designed format of intensive support. It prepares students for further college and careers. Funded by the Bay Area Workforce Funding Collaborative through the WIB, The Gateway Program will be offered in Fall 2007 and Spring 2008. The first of the information sessions were offered at Skyline College during the last week of June and will continue during the month of July. Attendees may: 1) learn about the program, 2) enroll in services through the federal Workforce Investment Act, 3) complete Skyline placement testing and 4) apply for admission to Skyline all in one stop.
