College Budget Committee (CBC) Update

CBC had its regular meeting on April 10, 2008.

- Enrollment & Productivity Update: Cathy Hasson reported that Skyline has generated 7,409 FTES to date compared to its goal of 6,938 FTES. Productivity is 565 compared to this year's goal of 570. She distributed the day's Hyperion report which shows FTES for the current spring semester compared to spring last year. Skyline showed a phenomenal 13% increase over spring last year.
- 2. Balancing Skyline's 2008-09 Budget: Eloisa Briones reported that we do not have the site allocation for 2008-09 since Kathy Blackwood is still gathering information needed for the revenue and expenditure estimates that go into the resource allocation model. In the meantime, Eloisa provided the CBC with a summary of potential savings and budget reductions that will offset the budget shortfall for next year. She also alerted the committee to variables and unknowns at the state and local level that should be taken into consideration as we review our projections as these will change our early budget assumptions.
