The Director of Undergraduate Admissions at Stanford noted in his address to the students that his not-so-hidden agenda in hosting the symposium was to interest more community college students in applying to Stanford. College Council update

The College Council met on April 23 and addressed the following topics:

1. **Budget update:** Vicki Morrow provided a brief update on the status of the state budget including the growing deficit and the shortfall in property taxes.
2. **Website redesign update:** Sandy Irber described the work of the Fresh Look Advisory Committee's Website Redesign group which is working with the consultant Interact on the project. The committee has already selected the key audiences for our website (called "pods") for each of which there will be a unique entrance into the site

and a tailored look and navigation for their part of the site. Interact will be providing three alternative graphic designs for our site and the committee will review those in early May.

3. **College Hour proposal:** Carla Campillo described the draft approach to College Hour prepared by a subcommittee including Anastasia Kuzina and Adolfo Leiva. It would include one or two hours on Tuesday, Thursday or Friday. The Council discussed whether the College Hour would be a time when no classes were offered, or limited class offerings such as labs. The Council identified several additional pieces of information to be gathered and the committee will meet again to refine the proposal. At the May council meeting, a decision will be made on whether to take the proposal out to the constituent groups for discussion or not.
4. **Follow up on the April 7 Open Forum on Governance:** This topic arises from both our accreditation self study findings and from a recommendation from the commission to create a policy for regular review of the governance process. The Council considered the findings from the discussion at the April 7 Forum. The notes from that event will be revised to highlight the recommendations made and then the constituent group leaders will take these to their organizations for discussion and additional ideas. The ultimate goal of the process is to identify any needed refinements to our governance process as well as to create a policy for regular evaluation of it.
5. **Design/Build Project update:** Vicki Morrow noted that the design work on the new Building 4N (Multicultural Center, Cosmetology, Classrooms and Administration) is well along and details will be available at the May 8 meeting of the EFMPP (Educational and Facilities Master Plan Project) Task Force. All members of the college are invited, and Vicki has announced the event in *Skyline Shines* and will continue to do so.
6. **District Shared Governance Council update (DSGC):** Carla Campillo reported on the topics addressed there including the faculty ethics statement (under discussion), the classified statement (in draft form) and the students' statement which has been approved; a review of the DSGC consensus building model; the District Strategic Plan; and the review of the district Rules and Regulations which is under way.
7. **District Strategic Planning Task Force update:** Vicki and Carla described the process of drafting the district strategic plan. There will be a Skyline Open Forum to discuss it on Wednesday, May 14, from 2-4 pm. The draft will be available electronically at least a week beforehand. The event is being announced in *Skyline Shines*.
8. **Proposed Student Equity Committee:** Vicki, Regina Stanback Stroud and Lori Adrian presented a draft description of a Student Equity Committee to replace the Student Access and Success Committee. Its charge would be to monitor and provide advice to the college upon the status of student equity and its membership would include representation from the various student equity related efforts across the college. The proposal will be taken to the various constituency groups for discussion.
