Website redesign update

The Web Site Redesign Project is moving along on schedule. In June, the Fresh Look Advisory Web Site Redesign Committee worked to select and refine new dynamic graphic web site designs. Variations of this design will be used in each of the areas designed for different types of visitors, or what are called "PODs." The colors were selected based on the color palette within Skyline's design standards for capital construction projects.

In the next few weeks, the web site templates will be tested for "508 compliance" to ensure their accessibility to people with disabilities, servers will be prepared, and the site will begin to be built with support from the District ITS team. Meanwhile, the current site's information will continue to be updated and inventoried. OmniUpdate, a content management system (CMS) piloted on the district web site, will allow the information management of the new website to be very user-friendly. The goal is to soft-launch the new web site (while keeping the old site up simultaneously for some time) at the end of the fall semester.

Silicon Valley Foundation awards grant to Skyline’s Hermanos program

The Silicon Valley Community Foundation awarded a grant of \$33,150 for salary support for the Hermanos Program at South San Francisco and Capuchino High Schools. The Hermanos Program addresses the academic, psychological and social needs of Latino males through academic support, mentoring and family support. The goal of Hermanos is to work with male students to address issues of poor motivation, lack of academic skills, college readiness; and to enroll these students in college upon high school graduation.

Auto Tech program trains instructors from all over North America

Our 2nd Annual Train-The-Trainer class was a tremendous success. Twenty-one instructors from across North America attended the class at Skyline College. Twenty-six hundred dollars in donations from the automotive industry was raised to offset the cost of refreshments, lunches, donuts, and materials.
