Update on the Facilities Master Plan and the next wave of construction

I am convening our Educational and Facilities Master Plan Project Task Force (EFMPP) right away on August 30 to help us with the planning for the next wave of construction. Over the summer we have acquired a more concrete sense of the real cost of building everything we mapped out for what we call CIP II—Capital Improvement Program II. We dreamed big, and I am glad of that, but it is clear that we will have to make some choices among the components we had hoped for. So the EFMPP will hear all about that, consider various scenarios for fitting our projects within the resources we have, and then will advise me on our best approach. I will discuss this a bit more in my Opening Day remarks. The divisions most directly affected by the project will have a chance to see details and discuss it on Monday in division meetings.

New Academic Planner and Student Handbook published

Skyline's 2007-2008 Academic Planner and Student Handbook will be available for free to all new and continuing students beginning August 21. This year's publication has been expanded to combine the Academic Planner, which is developed by the Counseling Department, and the Student Handbook, which is published each year by the Student Activities Office. The Academic Planner provides vital information, including "tips for success," that are beneficial to students' educational planning and decision making. The Student Handbook directs students to a wide variety of programs that support student success, and outlines key college policies, procedures, student rights, and responsibilities. Fundamentally, the Academic Planner and Student Handbook is designed as a navigational tool to guide students as they map out paths to success in a new and sometimes complex college environment. The new Academic Planner and Student Handbook was developed by the Student Activities Office and the Associated Students, in collaboration with the Office of the Vice President of Student Services, the Counseling Department, and the Office of College Development, Marketing, and Public Relations. thanks to Amory Cariadus, Coordinator of Student Activities, Shelly Hausman, Public Information Officer, and Lori Adrian, Vice President of Student Services for their leadership in this project.

Skyline MESA students make Bridges to Baccalaureate Summer Research Presentations Skyline MESA (Math, Engineering and Science Achievement) students have been participating in a summer research program along with students from the City College of San Francisco and the San Francisco State University Bridges and MARC (Minority Access to Research Careers) programs. Skyline hosts the governor of the state of Osun, Nigeria

On August 6, we had as a guest the governor of Osun state, Nigeria, who was in the US to develop new business relationships and to strengthen California ties. On his way to meet with Governor Schwarzenegger in Sacramento, Governor Olagunsoye Oyinlola stopped at Skyline College to meet with college staff to discuss possible agreements between Skyline and five of the universities in his state. The group considered ways of promoting and expanding international understanding by stimulating and supporting educational, professional and intercultural activities and projects between students and staff. The partnership could result in attracting Nigerian international student enrollment and the development of faculty exchange opportunities. Governor Oyinlola was hosted by the Center for International Trade Development, which is designed to assist small- to medium-size businesses in entering international trade.
