Sign up for emergency text message notification

I am repeating here a recent message from Eric Raznick about the new availability of emergency text message notification for all staff and students with cell phone service: "As we all know, providing a safe environment for staff and students throughout the District is a very important concern for all of us. The recent tragedy in Virginia Tech highlighted how important it is to be able to get emergency information to our college community as fast as possible. As part of the District response, ITS has been working on a process that uses text messages to send information quickly to everyone on campus. The idea is simple:

- Staff and students provide their cell phone number and provider information in WebSMART.
- In an Emergency, selected staff will have the ability to send an emergency text message to all
 those that have signed up. All you have to do is to log into WebSMART and follow the links to
 the "Emergency Text Message Contact Information" and add your contact information. We will
 be encouraging students to provide the same information as part of the registration process for
 the upcoming spring semester."

Nominate a student for All-USA Academic Team

The All-USA Academic Team program annually recognizes 60 outstanding two-year college students. Skyline students have been selected as All-USA Academic Team members. This comes with a cash

scholarship and a trophy. Additionally, nominees are eligible for the All-California Academic Team, and Skyline students have earned this distinction (and scholarship) every year. **Please ask eligible students to see Chris Case (738-4376) by October 20**.

Qualified nominees:

- Will have at least 45 semester (or 60 quarter) college-level credit hours either completed at or transferred to a community college by December 31, 2007, and be on a pace and intend to have at least 53 semester (79.5 quarter) college-level credit hours by August 31, 2008
- Will have a minimum of 30 semester (45 quarter) college-level credit hours completed at a community college in the past five years
- Are on track to obtain an associate's or bachelor's degree
- Post a minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.25 out of a possible 4.0 in all college credit coursework completed in the last five years

Jablonski comes to Skyline November 4

If you are a fan of *The Colbert Report*, you may have seen Nina Joblonski there talking about her book. She will be here at Skyline giving a presentation called "Living In Our Skin: The Biological and Social Meaning of Skin Color." This will be a free lecture by Nina Jablonski, Ph.D., Chair of Anthropology at Penn State University and author of the book, *Skin: A Natural History.* The renowned anthropologist will speak Thursday, November 8 from 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. at the Main Theatre.. Jablonski is the author of numerous articles on primate evolution, evolution of primate lineages in relation to environmental change and evolution of human skin coloration. She has done field work in China, Kenya and Nepal. A reception and book signing will follow. Discounted books will be available for purchase prior to the event at the Skyline College Bookstore.
