Accreditation site visit next week

The accreditation visiting team will arrive on campus next Tuesday morning, October 23. They will spend their time here interviewing people and reviewing the documents the college offered in evidence for the content of our self-study. While the team will be looking primarily at written documentation of our findings, they may ask for appointments with various people in order to delve more deeply into a specific area. Also, team members may drop in on some classes. There will be several public events while they are here:

These Open Forums are opportunities for any member of the college or the public to speak to the visiting team members about our programs and services. There will not be a presentation by the team.

Thursday, October 25: Exit Interview, 2-3 pm, Building 2, Room 2306

The chair of the visiting team will provide a brief oral report on the team's findings and describe the process that will occur afterward as the report is finalized and acted upon by the accrediting commission in January.

Counseling Department launches a new and improved Online Orientation for New Students In an effort to meet the varied orientation needs of our diverse student populations, Skyline's Counseling Department has revised and updated the Online Orientation as a companion to the "In person" orientation. Orientation is one of the five enrollment steps required for new students. Its purpose is to provide students with information about registration procedures, college policies, student services, academic expectations and information on how to accomplish their educational goals. Although the

Counseling Department strongly encourages students to attend In-Person Orientations, the Online Orientation is offered for students whose schedules do not permit that. The new Online Orientation is presented in a lesson format utilizing WebAccess, a software package used in the District for many other online courses. WebAccess offers many advantages for online instruction, including the ability to generate quizzes, keep track of student's scores and generate a Certificate of Completion at the end. The revised Online Orientation is expected to be in place for the Spring 2008 registration process. Special thanks to Professor Eric Larson of the Counseling Department who provided overall leadership on this project and who worked diligently over the summer and early fall to get this program launched. Thanks also to all the Counseling Department faculty and, in particular, the Orientation Committee who collaborated with Professor Larson on this project to ensure consistency in content between in-person and on-line orientation.

Skyline College students present at national scientific conference

Twelve Skyline MESA students presented their original scientific research at the Society for the Advances of Chicanos and Native Americans in Science (SACNAS) annual convention in Kansas City, Missouri. Skyline students presented alongside with students from the country's top universities such as MIT, University of Michigan, Yale, and other four-year schools and research centers. During the summer, these students worked in pairs or solo with Dr. Christine Case in the labs of Skyline's new 7A Science Annex. The students developed and implemented the experiments needed to solve their problem. They wrote their laboratory reports, including literature review, analysis of data, and conclusions before submitting an abstract of their work. Their abstracts were accepted for publication by scientist judges and the students presented their posters at the SACNAS convention October 11-13, 2007. Our published scientists are:


