The Disabled Students Programs and Services (DSPS) Holiday Raffle earned \$2,325. Prizes for the DSPS Raffle included a video game Nintendo Wii, a 30GB IPod with video and a Nintendo DS Lite. Skyline student athletes earn recognition

Two Skyline College student-athletes were recently recognized with Honorable Mentions in the CCCAA Student Athletes of the Month program for November. The award is given by the California Community Colleges Athletic Association (CCCAA), in partnership with the California Community College Sports Information Association (CCCSIA). Marie Colon is Skyline College Women's Basketball's starting point guard. She has averaged 17 points, 4 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 steals per game. She is currently shooting 40% from the field, 21% from the three point line, and is converting 89% of her free throws. She plans on transferring to a CSU in the fall. Esmeralda Lopez-Rivas is Skyline College Women's Basketball's starting shooting guard and has averaged 17.1 points, 6 rebounds, 2 assists and 3 steals per

game. She is currently shooting 46% from the field, 30% from the three point line, and is converting 71% of her free throws.

The initial group of Hermanos students from South San Francisco High School entered Skyline this fall, and last night this "first generation" cheered on the second generation, which has just completed its fall program. Study conducted by Skyline students to be showcased in national conference

Mike Moynihan and his students have had a presentation proposal accepted for a session at the national Foundations of Excellence in the First Year Experience conference in San Francisco on February 15, 2008. The following students will be part of the presentation: Frances Gilfillan, Elizabeth Demartini, Yajaira Barba, and Anthony Yup. The presentation will summarize the findings of a survey conducted with first year students at Skyline. The survey focused on how well first year students thought they were prepared for college-level work, how these students utilized campus counselors, how aware and informed these students are about Skyline's programs and services, how frequently they use and how satisfied they are with the various programs and services, and whether these students would be interested a required orientation to college program. By and large, the students thought that an orientation program

that provided information about academic components as well as pragmatic components would be especially helpful to their college success.
