### **Budget update**

As you may know from the news, there is still a great deal of uncertainty about the state's budget for both 2008-09 and for 2009-10. The Co-Chairs of our College Budget Committee (CBC), Eloisa Briones and Ray Hernandez, sent the following update to the CBC yesterday and I would like to share it with everyone.

Although the Budget Conference Committee has come to an agreement on the education budget, things are still very much in motion and the Legislature and the Governor have a long way to go before passing a final budget. Key aspects of the current version of the budget include:

- over \$800 million in cuts to community colleges, including categorical program reductions
- \$120 million apportionment reduction in the form of a workload reduction, and
- student enrollment fee increase from \$20 per unit to \$26 effective Fall 2009.

It may take some time before we know exactly what reductions our district will have to make for the current year (2008-09) and next year (2009-10). As we deal with these uncertainties, the district and college executive staff continue to brainstorm ideas to prepare for varying levels of cuts to the general fund, ranging from 10% to 25%. In addition, Student Services is closely monitoring the proposed reductions in categorical funding, and preparing for varying levels of impact on staffing, programs and services.

District and college-level budget reduction strategies that have been discussed and vetted through appropriate shared governance processes prior to the end of Spring 2009 are being implemented.

- Retirement incentives have been offered.
- Managed hiring is in progress.

Despite all the odds, Skyline continues to shine. Summer FTES is up 10% from summer '08, and load is at 617. As always, everyone is doing a superb job in serving our students and community, and in fulfilling our mission.

In the absence of more concrete information about the budget, there will be no need for CBC to meet on Thursday as originally scheduled. We will keep you posted on any new developments. ### **Skyline receives federal stimulus funding from the San Mateo County Workforce Investment Board**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA, the Economic Stimulus Bill) is an effort to jumpstart the economy, and create or save jobs. Skyline College responded to a request from the San Mateo County Workforce Investment Board (WIB) to propose education opportunities in anticipation of ARRA funding. On June 18, 2009, the Workforce Investment Board voted to allocate ARRA funding for three instructional programs that Skyline proposed to help people get the education needed for jobs in this ever changing economy. Those programs include:

- Auto Service Technician Program: This 2.5 unit program will serve up to 23 students during the 2009 - 2010 year.
- Emergency Medical Technician - B Certificate Program: This 7 unit program will serve up to 25 students during the 2009 - 2010 year.
- Medical Coding and Billing Certificate Program: This 17 unit program will serve up to 25 students during the 2009 - 2010 year.

Vice President of Instruction Regina Stanback Stroud worked with Deans Margie Meadows and Mike Williamson, and William Watson, Director of Workforce Development, to create and submit a proposal for

a group of programs designed to prepare people in manageable timeframes for desirable career opportunities. Funding for the entire project totals \$258,939.

### **Classified staff recognized at annual service awards luncheon**

Each year at a luncheon, we honor classified staff who have achieved milestones in their careers with this district, and this year we did that on May 15. The honorees are recognized by a supervisor and they receive a certificate and a gift. ### **Name changes implemented for Theater and Gallery**

The College Council recently considered a proposal to change the names of two Skyline buildings:

- *Main Theater* to become *Theater*
- *Gallery Theater* to become *Gallery*.

These changes have been recommended to the chancellor and approved, so we will use these new names henceforward. They will communicate much more clearly the uses of these facilities and eliminate confusion for students and the public. The new names will be incorporated into the signage planning work which is under way at this moment.

### **Skyline College spring athletics wrap-up**

Skyline College athletic teams and students enjoyed a successful finish to the sports season. 72 students participated in the spring semester in Women's Basketball, Men's Basketball, Baseball and Women's Badminton. Women's Basketball finished the season with an overall record of 24-7 finishing third in the Coast Conference North division and qualifying for the state playoffs a second year in a row. The Men's Basketball team finished their season with an overall record of 18-14 finishing third in the Coast Conference North division and qualified for the state playoffs for the first time since 2003. Our Baseball team completed the season 27-16 finishing second in the Coast Conference Pacific Division. In Women's

Badminton, our team finished 6-2 overall which was good enough to for second place in the Coast Conference. In singles and doubles competition, our top singles player and doubles team reached the state quarterfinals.

Eighteen individuals received recognition as All-League, All-State and/or All American Selections. The individual are: Laura Zasly (Women's Basketball - 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Conference and 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-State), Katie Zasly (Women's Basketball - 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Conference), Danielle Simon (Women's Basketball - Honorable Mention), Jennifer Matawaran (Women's Basketball - Honorable Mention), Sean Echols (Men's Basketball - 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Conference), Matt Fotchman (Men's Basketball - Honorable Mention - All Conference), Ronney Freeman (Men's Basketball - Honorable Mention - All Conference), Rodney Freeman (Men's Basketball - Honorable Mention - All Conference), Marcus Pointer (Baseball - Coast Conference Pacific Pitcher of the Year and All-American), Greg Gonzalez (Baseball - 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Conference and All-American), Tony Loeffler (Baseball - 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Conference), Lucas Hagberg (Baseball - 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Conference), Taylor Heon (Baseball - 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Conference and Finalist Rawlings Gold Glove Award), Cody Larson (Baseball - 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Conference), Jesse Orozco (Baseball - 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Conference), Nico Vargas (Baseball - 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Conference), Nour Abudamous (Women's Badminton - All Conference Singles and Doubles), Rachele Berania (Women's Badminton - All Conference Singles and Doubles). With the exception of one student, all these individuals attended high school in San Mateo or San Francisco County.

Academically, our teams had a cumulative GPA of 3.09. Women's Basketball (3.45) and Baseball (3.13) both had team GPA's above a 3.0. The completion rate for all course attempted by student-athletes was 87% and 28 students achieved a 3.0 grade point average or higher while completing 12 or more units in the spring semester.

### **Storefront awards for Fashion Merchandising students**

The Small Business Neighborhood Renovation Project, funded by Wells Fargo, asked the question "Who could best spend \$2,000 to renovate the image of a local retail store? Skyline College Instructors Ally Nuschy and Michael Murphy organized five teams of students who worked on store renovation projects in San Mateo County. Skyline student Ruby Daroy, who headed the team, along with Rachel Marshall, Jaice Teotico and Catherine Sarcos renovated Lonora Gold in South San Francisco. Owner Luis Campos says, " I know that they had \$2,000 to spend, but with all the labor they put into the project , I feel like I got \$10,000 worth."
