### **WIT luncheon recognizes student success**

Wednesday marked the fourth annual Women in Transition (WIT) program luncheon and it was attended by dozens of current and former WIT students, along with Skyline faculty and staff. Program coordinator

Lori Slicton was responsible for the event and she brought Skyline grad and former WIT student Akillah Wali back to speak to the WIT students. Here is an excerpt from Akillah's remarks:

When I began taking classes at Skyline, I was 28, and had already endured an unsuccessful college attempt, abbreviated military service and divorce. "Failure" was something I knew all too well, and it was difficult for me to shake the feelings of inadequacy that I accumulated over the years. When I finally rediscovered my passion for education, I was still unable to fully enjoy the experience, as I was gripped with the fear that I had not learned from my mistakes, and that I was doomed to add another near-miss to my list of shortcomings. My expectations upon my return were filled with visions of being leagues older than my counterparts, and of being left to my own devices by faculty and staff. I thought that this was going to be yet another of those experiences where I would just have to close my eyes and hold on, hoping that the dizzying ride stopped moving before I lost my stomach. I was pleasantly surprised to find the staff in the counseling office were extremely accommodating and sympathetic – and that they were extremely willing to assist in whatever I needed – provided they knew that I was working harder than they were to ensure my success. The classrooms were more of the same. My tenacity and curiosity were welcomed, and the professors were always on hand to answer whatever questions arose, and it didn't seem to matter whether the questions were course related or not – it was just a matter of never being afraid to ask a question and admitting that I didn't understand or, more importantly, that I needed help. This experience gave me the confidence – and the ego boost required to transfer to Columbia University, where I would complete a BA in Sociology.

Akillah will enter a graduate program in public policy at the University of Minnesota in the fall.

### **BioBus Tour brings Carlmont High School students to Skyline**

On Wednesday, April 29, twenty-four Carlmont High School students, along with their instructors, Dan Raffa and Dr. Tina Doss, participated in a day-long BioBus experience. Activities began with a State of the Biotechnology Workshop and continued with an Outreach Presentation by Jocelyn Vila, Patty Mendoza, and Nate Nevado. Students were informed about financial aid, Priority Enrollment for High School Seniors (PEP) and general information about Skyline College's programs and services. After lunch, the tour concluded with a "hand's-on" experiment led by Dr. Melissa Michelitsch on creating a kaleidoscope with column chromatography. The same methods are used in the Biotechnology industry to purify drugs by removing contaminants. Coordinated by Adolfo Leiva, the activity is part of a grant managed by Skyline College's Center for Workforce Development and funded by the Chancellors Office California Community Colleges, to enhance Career and Technical Education connections between high schools and colleges. Special thanks to Dr. Nick Kapp, Dean Michael Williamson and the Biology 415 students for assisting with the BioBus experience.

### **CITD hosts REEM (Renewable Energy in Emerging Markets) conference**

This week, Richard Soyombo, Executive Director of Skyline's Center for International Trade Development (CITD) and his staff hosted the inaugural Renewable Energy in Emerging Markets (REEM) conference at the Hotel Nikko in San Francisco. More than 27 countries attended this unprecedented networking opportunity for renewable energy technology providers, investors, government officials, public implementers, media and renewable energy enthusiasts. The conference had the overwhelming support of luminaries from across the US, Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean. The distinguished Host Committee includes Speaker of the United States House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi, Senator Barbara Boxer, Congresswoman Jackie Speier, and Mayor Gavin Newsome among numerous other officials, leaders and experts. Emerging markets are particularly interesting for renewable energy producers because of the ability to leap frog technologies and infrastructure. While there is an immediate need to train the workforce, as indicated by the panelists, the need to expand markets is important to provide for sustainable employment in the long run. Industry representatives who presented at the conference included SunEdison, SunPower, PG&E and other. Among the results of the conference include at least three trips that have been planned by California-based renewable energy technology companies to travel to Honduras, Guatemala and Mozambique. The CITD has planned and had the pleasure to announce the location for REEM 2010, which will be hosted by the governments of Guatemala and Honduras.
