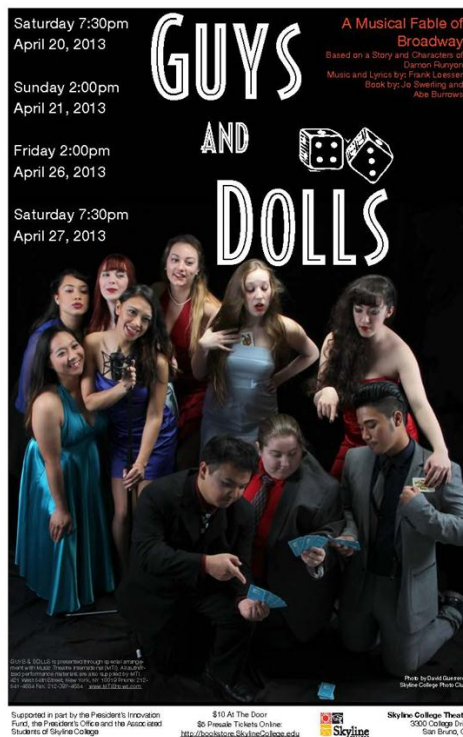

Anthropology Club Attends The Society for California Archaeology Conference

Professors Lori Slicton (Anthropology) and George Buckingham (History) accompanied members of the Skyline College Anthropology Club to the Society of California Archaeology 2013 conference in Berkeley. The multi-day conference provided Anthropology Club members an opportunity to hear scholarly research by University faculty and student presenters. Highlights for the SCA conference were fascinating topics such as using isotopes to determine migration and nutrition patterns of indigenous Californians; coastal bio archaeology, and the excavation of San Jose’s China Town. A special favorite was the canine forensics team which the Anthropology Club wishes to invite for Archaeology Awareness Month in May for a “working dog” demonstration. Canine forensics teams work with archaeologists, law enforcement, and search and rescue efforts.

Who Are the TRiO Students?

The goal of the Skyline College TRiO Student Support Services (SSS) Program is to assist first-generation, low-income and learning/physically disabled students to graduate with an associate degree and/or certificate and transfer to an institution of higher education (IHE). This is the first of a two-part report on the TRiO SSS Program, part one looks at who are the TRiO SSS Program students attending Skyline College offering demographic snapshots in the ethnicity, eligibility and gender of the 333 students it served for the 2012-13 academic year. The source for this information is the United States Department of Education’s Blumen database which requires a very comprehensive set of characteristics be entered and tracked for each TRiO student.

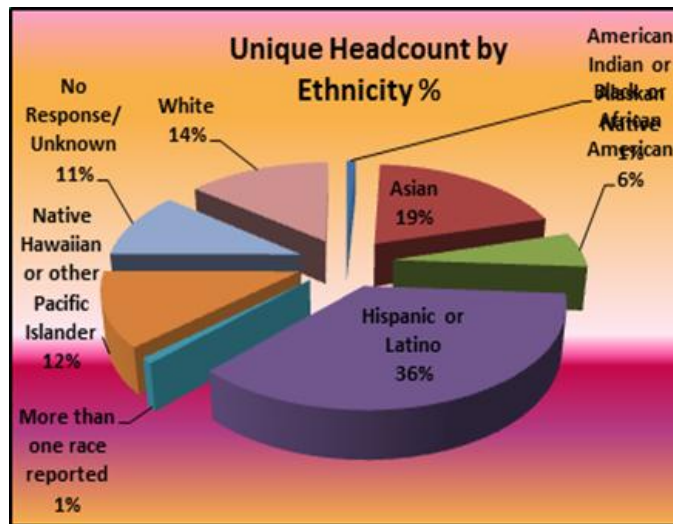


Figure 1. Unique Headcount by Ethnicity %

Figure 1 displays that 75% of the 2012-13 cohort is a member of a racial-ethnic group (250 students). As a student support service program TRiO/SSS Program has applied best practices and processes related to intake, assessment, academic counseling and learning support to contribute to campus equity and student success at the College.

The TRiO/SSS Program is executing practices that support the Stewardship for Equity, Equal Employment and Diversity (SEED) Committee’s goal of creating a campus climate of diversity regardless of socioeconomic status, gender, ethnicity, religion, culture, sexual preference or disability.

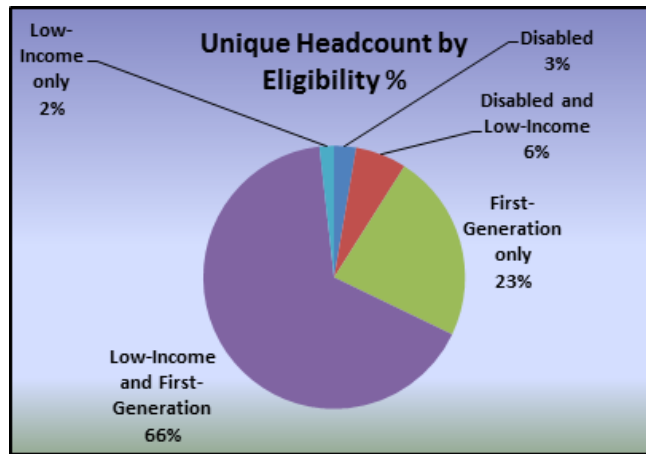


Figure 2. Unique Headcount by Eligibility%

Figure 2 shows the TRiO SSS Program has been successful in its efforts to support students who are a traditionally underrepresented community of learners in postsecondary education either because of income, family educational background and/or disability. The majority (66%) of TRiO students are low-income and first-generation, meaning for a single individual she or he is earning less than \$16,755/year and neither parent graduated from an IHE.

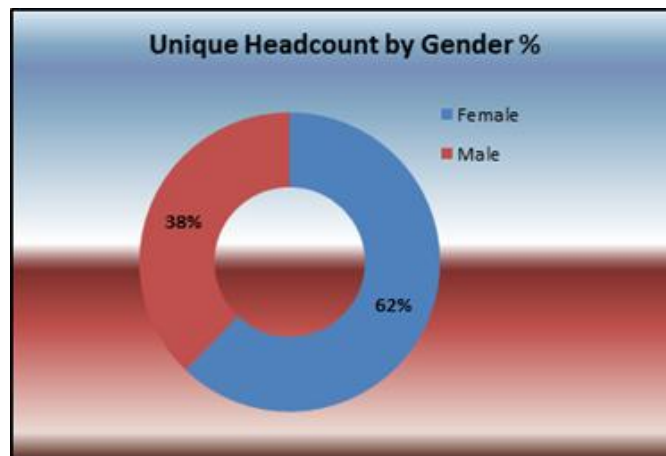


Figure 3. Unique Headcount by Gender %

Figure 3 reveals that 62% (206 female) of the students taking advantage of the TRiO SSS program are female which coincides with gender representation in the general student population at Skyline College of 62% (Source: SMCCCD Data Warehouse).

This data is important because while racial and gender gaps exist at all educational levels, education cuts the gap dramatically as returns for education are greatest for women of color.

Skyline College Student Wins First Public Safety Scholarship

Administration of Justice major, Gilbert Arellano, received the first Richard L. Resurreccion Public Safety Scholarship at the Phi Theta Kappa convention on April 5, 2013.

This scholarship is for members of Phi Theta Kappa who demonstrate potential for involvement in public safety or service while enrolled in an associate degree public safety program (e.g. Criminal Justice, Emergency Medical Services). Applicants may be part-time, full-time or international students. Applicants must have a minimum 3.5 GPA on all course work and complete by June at least 50 percent of coursework in an associate degree public safety program at a two-year college. Applicants with previous associate, bachelor's, or master's degrees are eligible.

The objectives of the in-bound trade-mission was to promote business development opportunities with the entrepreneurs while also providing examples of local entrepreneurial work, particularly work established by women. The women entrepreneurs come from various locations and trades in Canada ranging from CEO/Presidents of different Chamber of Commerce, international market development and trade, marketing and event companies, and even pharmaceutical industries.





Other guests who attended the delegation roundtable included Alex Kramer from the Cabrillo College Business and Entrepreneurship Center and YEP Advisory Board and Jamie Monozon of the San Bruno Chamber of Commerce. Topics discussed were the entrepreneur industries, the regional support and establishment of entrepreneurship education throughout California in the form of a deliverable program, and discussion of a Business Incubator in the city of San Bruno.

As a result of the roundtable discussion, CITD is in the beginning stages of developing opportunities for curriculum sharing, contract education and future trade missions within Canada.

African American Museum and Library of Oakland Coming to Skyline College

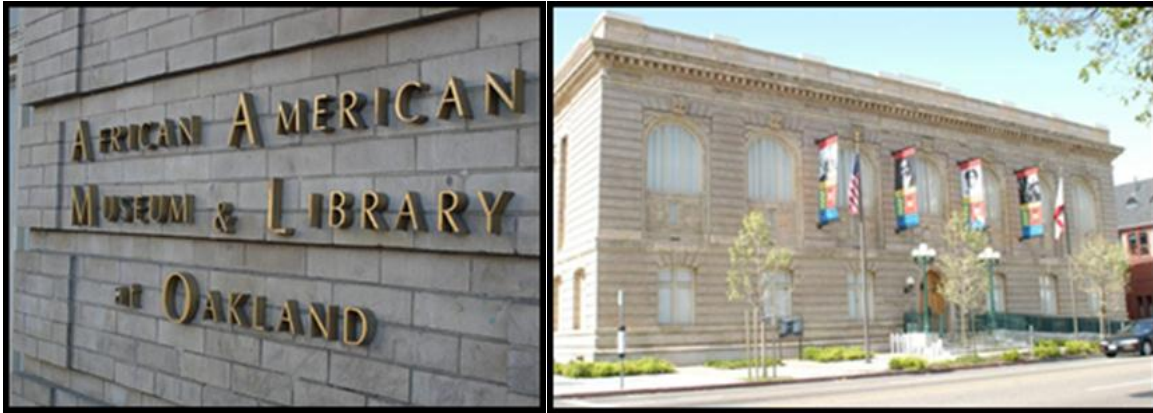

Over 25 students attended and got critical tips and information on how to get ahead and plan their next steps in their pathway. Students had several different questions about enrollment, orientation, financial aid and more.

Student comments on the workshop were overwhelmingly positive. One student said that it was easier to get direct answers to questions and another student commented that they liked the level of honest information and helpful insight into the process of transferring.

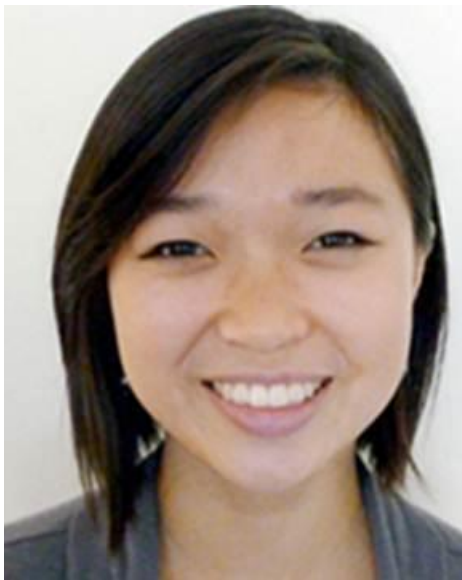

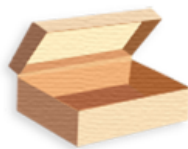
Many of you submit material to be included in Skyline Shines. Thanks so much for taking to time to help me keep the college informed. Here are a few guidelines that will facilitate the publication of Skyline Shines each week:

Send submission to skylineshines@smccd.edu

- **Submit your article by 3:00 p.m. on Thursdays; articles received after this time will appear in the following week's issue.**
- Place your submission in a Word document with your pictures pasted in the document.
- Use medium sized pictures that are equal to 1/4 or 1/2 of a page. Do not place pictures next to each other, they must be on separate lines.
- Use Times New Roman 12pt. font that is justified to the left for the body of the article.
- Please make sure your article is single spaced.
- Don't forget to add a headline/title using 18 pt. bold font that is justified to the center
- Use the following commonly accepted abbreviations: a.m. or p.m. (i.e. ³The event will be held from 8:00 a.m. 1:30 p.m.² ³The workshop is scheduled to run from 9:30 a.m. Noon.²
- Spell out numbers of one or two words. Use figures for numbers that require more than two words to spell out. (i.e., ³Almost eight years ago I began taking ceramics courses.² And ³I counted 176 records on the shelf.²).
- If a sentence begins with a number, spell out the number or rewrite the sentence.
- Use the month, day, a comma and the year to indicate the date (i.e., ³March 4, 2011² not ³March 4th, 2011 or March 2nd, 2011²).
- Add the word College when you refer to the name Skyline (i.e., Skyline College instead of Skyline).
