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## Middle School Outreach Project

Funded by the President's Innovation Fund and in collaboration with the President's Council and Parkway Heights Middle School in South San Francisco, the Middle School Outreach Project was created to expose middle school students to college and careers at a young age. In addition, it provided information to parents in an effort to foster and support their development as educational advocates for their child.



As part of the project, Skyline College counselors facilitated a series of by-weekly educational and career-related workshop at Parkway Heights Middle School throughout the months of February and March, 2013. Thirty-one middle school students participated in these workshops and learned about Goal Setting, Motivation, College Preparedness, and Career Planning. Students were very engaged and highly inquisitive!



In addition, we hosted Parent Night at Parkway Heights Middle School on Thursday, March 21, 2013. Over twenty-five parents attended the event and received important information about high school requirements, the various systems of higher education in California, financial aid and the process to apply for it.



Lastly, on Tuesday, March 26, 2013, we hosted the first Middle School Outreach Conference at Skyline College for our thirty-one participating middle school students and Parkway Heights staff. At the conference, students heard from first-year Skyline College students speak about their high school and college experiences. They toured the campus, learned about different programs and student clubs, and visited various CTE labs, including Respiratory Therapy, Surgical Tech, and Auto Tech. Furthermore, they had the opportunity to experience a college class firsthand!



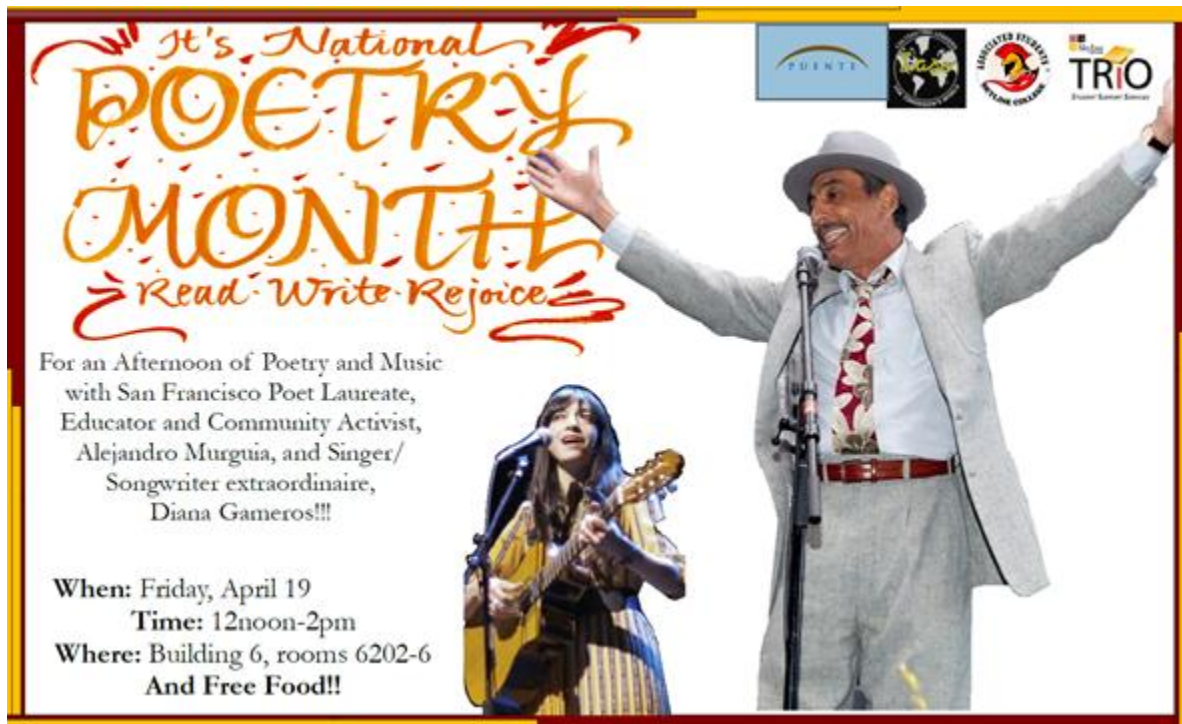
The Middle School Outreach Project was a tremendous success, which served to instill motivation and the desire to attend college among participants. In their own words:

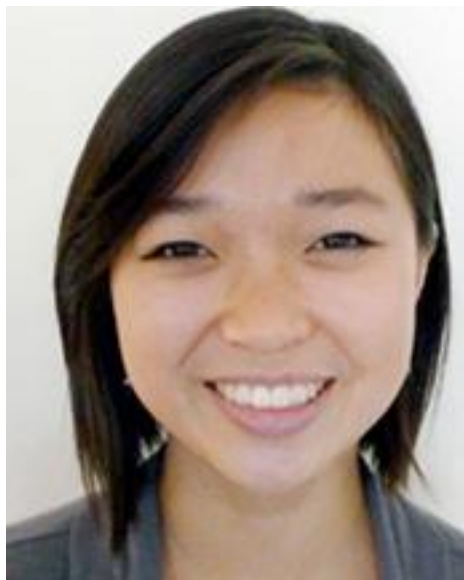


## Skyline College Students on All-California Academic Team

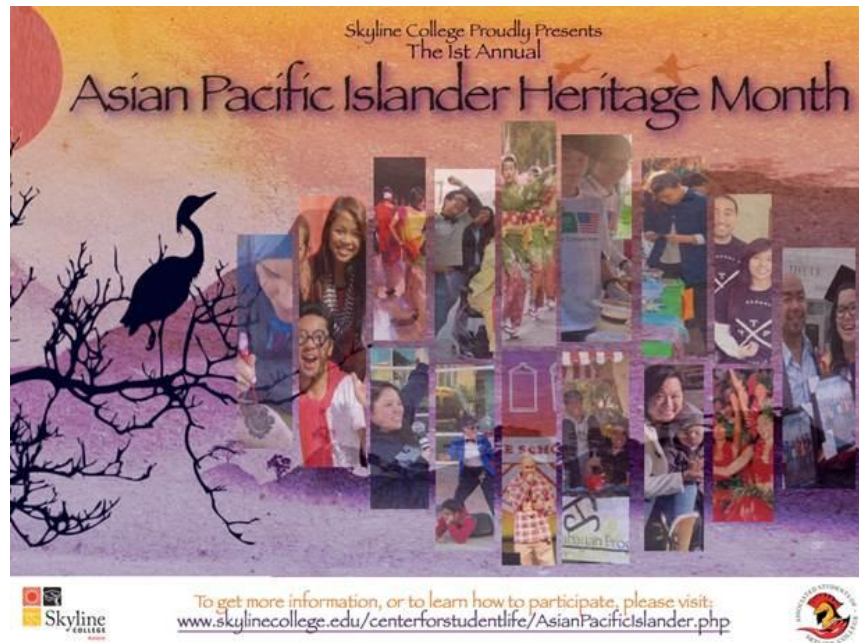


### **Sarah Kay**

## TRiO Students Discover UCLA and UCI



According to a recent report in the Chronicle of Higher Education, “64% of students surveyed said they used campus visits to find out about colleges and universities. Most students (71%) said a campus visit was their most trusted source of information . . .” (Source: Chronicle for Higher Education, May 25, 2007). TRiO provides academic and student support services to prepare first-generation, low-income and/or learning/physical challenged student to graduate with an associate degree and transfer to an institution of higher education, in that capacity TRiO also serves as a transition bridge in students’ next step in higher education.

For many low-income students a campus visit is beyond their economic means, in an effort to “level the playing field” and expand the transfer horizons of Skyline College TRiO students, sixteen TRiO students took the opportunity to visit the campuses of UC Los Angeles and UC Irvine during the Spring Break. Students had the occasion to explore each campus by taking a tour, eating lunch in a residence hall dining commons, and meeting with student support and transfer staff to hear “how to succeed as a transfer student at the UC.” The most emphasized advice was “to immediately access campus resources and learn how to manage your time.” When asked to reflect on the trip, one student commented, “To not be scared, I learned there are programs and services that will help me on my path to success.” Another student stated, “I enjoyed being able to get a feel for the environment and learn about the services make me feel more at ease transferring to a UC.” The campus visits were a major success serving to promote Skyline College TRiO’s goal of having its students transfer to a UC!

### **Discuss/Approve Minutes**

The March 13, 2013 minutes. M/S/U – Blake/McCoy Approved Minutes

### **Discuss/Approve EMP**

The committee decided to recommend adding an amendment to the plan with the following recommendations:

Add 1.4: Strategy 1.4 ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT LEARNING: Ensure that Skyline College assesses student learning at the course, program and institutional levels, engages in shared reflection on the results of these assessments, and uses the results to sustain or improve student learning;

Revise 1.2 The IPC also embedded an equity statement to enhance the previous version's descriptor:

Strategy 1.2. STUDENT ACCESS, SUCCESS, & EQUITY IN OUTCOMES: Student access to the college, student success in achieving their goals, and equity in student outcomes for all student populations.

M/S/U – Joi Blake/Karen Wong Approved the amendment. Leigh Anne Shaw abstained.

A motion was made to recommend the EMP to the College Governance Council with the above amendments. M/S/U - Leigh Anne Shaw/Joi Blake

### **Merge IPC & CBC**

The committee discussed the merging of the IPC and CBC committees. Dr. Ulate asked if there could be a recommendation made today to forward on to the College Governance Council regarding the merger.

Concerns were raised regarding the membership of the merged committees and what the guidelines would be for representation by all constituencies. Also a concern regarding the planning functions of IPC and that if merged with CBC less planning would occur because the focus would be on budget items. Leigh Anne Shaw commented that more faculty members attend CBC and if the merger is approved, would this result in fewer opportunities for faculty participation.

It was suggested that the current co-chairs of the IPC and CBC meet to create scenarios of how the merged committee would look. For instance, there would be three co-chairs of the merged committee and meetings would have standing agenda items that are addressed at each meeting—e.g. budget and planning items. It was decided that once the scenarios are created they will be emailed to the IPC members to vote electronically.



### **Technology Plan**

Dr. Perkins reported to the committee that the Technology Plan has been updated and posted on the website. Primarily the budget and some additional editing were updated. Currently the plan is being used to replace laptops and replacement of computers in the Instructional Labs which will be done in late Summer. Any questions regarding ordering replacement computers should be through the Division Dean's and Vice President's.

Skyline College has a complete Technology Plan and is being used as a model at the other campuses.

### **Enrollment Management Self-Assessment Summary**

Dr. Ulate shared with the committee that the Enrollment Management Self-Assessment Summary is located online for review. It was suggested that Dr. Ulate draft a list of highlights from the summary to focus on and send to the IPC members for additions or edits. The summary is on the Planning Research Institutional Effectiveness website for review.

### **New CCCO Scorecard**

The California Community College Chancellor's Office has a new CCCO Scorecard available on their website. You are now able to view any California Community College profile. The interpretation of the data is built on a cohort model.

### **ACCJC Annual Report**

The ACCJC Annual Report is due April 15 and it is 90% done. A special acknowledgement to Karen Wong and Bob McCoy for their help in preparing the report. The report will be sent to the IPC members once completed. The report has no narrative, just numbers.

### **Accreditation Oversight Committee**

The Accreditation Oversight Committee will be created in order to oversee new requirements from the ACCJC. The membership of the committee is being discussed and once finalized will be added to the Compendium of Committees.

## Guidelines for Skyline Shines Submissions

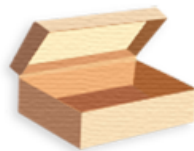
Many of you submit material to be included in Skyline Shines. Thanks so much for taking to time to help me keep the college informed. Here are a few guidelines that will facilitate the publication of Skyline Shines each week:

**Send submission to [skylineshines@smccd.edu](mailto:skylineshines@smccd.edu)**

- **Submit your article by 3:00 p.m. on Thursdays; articles received after this time will appear in the following week's issue.**
- Place your submission in a Word document with your pictures pasted in the document.
- Use medium sized pictures that are equal to 1/4 or 1/2 of a page. Do not place pictures next to each other, they must be on separate lines.
- Use Times New Roman 12pt. font that is justified to the left for the body of the article.
- Please make sure your article is single spaced.
- Don't forget to add a headline/title using 18 pt. bold font that is justified to the center
- Use the following commonly accepted abbreviations: a.m. or p.m. (i.e. <sup>3</sup>The event will be held from 8:00 a.m. 1:30 p.m.<sup>2</sup> <sup>3</sup>The workshop is scheduled to run from 9:30 a.m. Noon.<sup>2</sup>
- Spell out numbers of one or two words. Use figures for numbers that require more than two words to spell out. (i.e., <sup>3</sup>Almost eight years ago I began taking ceramics courses.<sup>2</sup> And <sup>3</sup>I counted 176 records on the shelf.<sup>2</sup>).
- If a sentence begins with a number, spell out the number or rewrite the sentence.
- Use the month, day, a comma and the year to indicate the date (i.e., <sup>3</sup>March 4, 2011<sup>2</sup> not <sup>3</sup>March 4th, 2011 or March 2nd, 2011<sup>2</sup>).
- Add the word College when you refer to the name Skyline (i.e., Skyline College instead of Skyline).
