Narrative

The International Student Program supports the mission of Skyline college and the goals of the Global Learning Programs and Services by promoting diversity and by enabling students to reach their fullest potential regardless of economic, educational, or physical disadvantages and/or cultural differences. The international student population currently consists of students from 43 different countries, which helps diversify the campus community. In addition, international students bring a global perspective to the campus community, add to the country's scientific and technical research, create an atmosphere of global learning and inter-cultural understanding, and improve the learning experience of domestic students. The International Student Program is devoted to fostering student learning and to enabling international students to reach their fullest potential by providing guidance and support in the following areas:

- Academic: The International Student Support Program strives to ensure that students reach their academic goals by monitoring their attendance, units, educational goals, and academic performance and by helping students to set realistic academic and personal goals and to seek out resources, which will help them to accomplish their goals.
- SEVIS Compliance: The International Student Program ensures that students comply with college regulations as well as regulations governing F-Visa holders by informing students of the regulations governing F-Visa holders, by conducting arrival orientations and student workshops, by monitoring students' legal status, and by complying with the SEVIS reporting requirements and maintaining accurate student records.
- Cultural: The International Student Program assists students with the cultural adjustment process and to connect international students with domestic students on campus.
- International student recruitment: In order to increase the enrollment of the international student population and to build a self-sustaining program, the ISP holds many outreach events nationally and internationally.

According to Open Doors (2017) "IIE conducted a separate online fall enrollment survey with nine other education associations in September and October 2017 to provide an early look at what campuses are seeing now for the current 2017/18 academic year. The nearly 500 colleges and universities responding reported continued flattening in the overall number of enrolled students and an average decrease of 7 percent in the number of new enrolled students."

In relation to Goal 1: To improve the retention and the transfer of international students at Skyline College. ISP will implement a comprehensive counseling model.

International Student counseling course. Starting Fall 2018, we will have a mandatory counseling course (1/2 unit) during the first semester for all international students. The course will provide an overview of the U.S. higher education system, classroom expectations, academic honesty, student visa requirements, transfer process and familiarize the students with the campus support services. This course will expand on some of the topics presented during orientation.

Dedicated International student counselor. We have a dedicated/ well trained academic counselor to assist international students with their academic needs. This counseling model will enable counselors to build a personal relationship with their advisees and comprehend the unique needs of each international student.

Early Alert System (EAS). EAS is a collaborative process between the faculty, the international student program and the academic counselor. The purpose is to learn about international students at-risk of being dropped or failing their courses before it is too late. After identifying at-risk students, an ISP staff / academic counselor assesses their needs and direct them to the proper support services. EAS provides ISP with the opportunity to develop a support structure based on the student needs. (we are doing this manually by emailing every professor at the beginning of every semester)

Comprehensive Education Plan. The Plan provides international students with the list of courses they need based on their majors and transfer goals. International students receive this document during their first semesters (after 1 hr meeting with counselor). The purpose of this tool is to mitigate the risk of taking unnecessary courses and provide students with a guided pathway from the Skyline to the four-year institution of their choice. Also, the academic



counselor take into consideration the students' transfer destination when building this plan.

In relation to Goal two: To increase international student enrollment ISP will participate in all approved district outreach activities in the U.S. and internationally.
