Guided Pathways leads the Comprehensive College Redesign in an effort to redesign the College to address our brutal truths and equity gaps. Guided Pathways works to support students through the creation and implementation of Meta Majors and Guided Pathways as well as other Transformative Teaching and Learning components of the Redesign, such as: Student Success Teams, Thematic General Education; and the of ePortfolio across disciplines.

The program supports the Skyline College Mission "to empower and transform a global community of learners" by recognizing that we are all teachers and learners. The goal of the Comprehensive College Redesign is to disrupt "business as usual" and empower every member of the faculty, staff, and administration, in partnership with students, to engage in critical reflection and evaluation of institutional policies, practices, and procedures, thereby promoting deeper engagement, more innovative approaches, a constantly evolving consciousness, and a greater likelihood for praxis and transformation. As a campus, we have a achieved a tremendous amount in terms of implementing some of the structural components of the Comprehensive College Redesign including: development of four Meta Majors, implementation of Program Maps (Guided Pathways), Student Success Teams, and incorporation of ePortfolio across disciplines, among others.

Opportunities to improve effectiveness:

- To date, the work has been completed by a small group of faculty, classified professionals, and administrators across campus and has not truly been incorporated into the various roles on campus. For the Redesign to be truly comprehensive and for us to become a Student Ready College, every area of campus needs to take ownership and there needs to be strong directive from the leadership.
- Elements of the Redesign need to be institutionalized if they are going to continue, including:
 - Director of Guided Pathways Position
 - Faculty Leadership for 10 + 1 elements of the Redesign
- Meta Majors need to be incorporated more into classrooms and programs. Currently students are introduced to them through orientation but then they do not interact with them except through events like Meta Majors week. For them to be meaningful for students, they need to be incorporated into all events, classes, and conversations on campus.
