

PROGRAM GOALS

More student completion in CTE programs, in jobs/careers and more earning more money in their careers

- MORE Increase the amount of CTE instruction delivered (FTES, Headcount)
- BETTER Continuously improve CTE outcomes (Success, Completion, Job Placement, Job Retention, Wages, Employer Engagement) with a particular focus on completion of industry valued credentials, job placement, and wage advancement
- ALIGNMENT
 - Sector strategies: Engage with industry to align CTE programs with leading and emergent sectors
 - Career pathways: Align services across multiple providers to enable progressive skills development within a career pathway that has multiple entry points, and multiple exit points that each deliver labor market gains
 - Regional partnerships: Build partnerships of industry, labor, education, workforce and economic development entities and civic leaders to develop workforce and education policies that support economic growth
 - Workforce Development Systems: Align efforts (CC, WDB, AEBG, K-12) to provide comprehensive regional career pathways that align with industry sectors

Investment Proposal

A. SKYLINE COLLEGE PROMISE

\$180,000

Description:

- Fund students to enroll in 3-4 CTE Certificate Pathways as part of the Skyline College Promise Initiative
 - o 11/2 year CTE pathway experience
 - o Last Dollar Funding
 - o Textbooks / Lending Library
 - Direct Support, Promise Scholarship and SparkPoint delivery of financial literacy training and coaching
 - o Other Public Transportation Vouchers
- Priority Placement: Middle College students and graduating seniors at feeder high schools
- Job Placement upon completion

Performance Measure Impact Area:

"More" - Completion - certificates and degrees, Equity: increased access, and job placement

Formula: \$1,500 x 100 students and \$30,000 for SparkPoint Services

B. NEW CTE PATHWAY DEVELOPMENT & EXISTING PROGRAM REDESIGN

\$449,400

Description:

Provide funding for new CTE program development and redesign of existing programs to connect with work that is happeing with the Skyline College Promise and efforts to meet career and workforce development needs in the county. Faculty led and employer-informed curriculum development, research, program design, employer engagement, equipment

Performance Impact Area:

"More and Better", Employer Engagement, Completion - certificates and degrees, Equity: increased access,

Formula: examples include: $8 \text{ new programs} - 8 \times \$25,000 = \$200,000$

13 redesign - \$15,000 - = \$195,000

** Recommended to rotate investments each year, so programs have large upfront funding to complete the work







C. CREATION OF JOB PLACEMENT SERVICES: SPECIALIZED JOB DEVELOPERS \$286,000

Description:

Job placement and internship development by division, tracking and reporting. Specialized and familiar with industries and pathways in each division, narrowly focused to serve CTE students and act as a division specific program support to drive results.
