
- Focus is on strategies and skill development

- Expanding the technology choices for students












GUIDING YOUR PATH TO SUCCESS (GPS)

- Students w/ IEPs attend counselor liaison activities at their high school, no segregation from peers
- DRC Open House for parents and students to learn about the transition from high school into college
- DRC Experience allows students to come to campus during school day for hands-on technology experience and to discuss accommodations
- Follow up events: Welcome Day, Dinner & a Chat, executive function support with GPS Guide




Math Support




Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of their disabilities, accommodations, and services available to them.



Students will show they are **satisfied** with the types and availability of services provided by DRC.




