Located on an 111-acre site overlooking the Pacific Ocean just south of San Francisco in San Bruno, Skyline College offers world-class educational opportunities to residents from North San Mateo County and beyond in a culturally rich and globally informed environment.

Over 17,000 students annually enroll in a broad range of affordable day, evening, weekend and online courses. Students can complete transfer degrees (AA-T/AS-T) guaranteeing admission into the CSU system, or lower division general education requirements at Skyline College and then transfer to four-year colleges and universities to earn a bachelor's degree. Other Skyline College students graduate and achieve an Associate in Arts (A.A.) or Associate in Science (A.S.) degree. Additionally, Skyline College offers the latest in career technical education through such nationally acclaimed programs as Allied Health, Automotive Technology, Business, Cosmetology, Emergency Medical Technician, Environmental Technology, Hospitality, Retail and Tourism, Massage Therapy, Respiratory Therapy and Surgical Technology.

Students benefit from excellent educational programs, state-of-the-art technology, One Stop Student Support Services, integrated student services and instruction through learning communities and an innovative environment that supports student success.


