

Curriculum Committee Report - September 3, 2020

The Curriculum Committee held its first meeting on Wednesday, August 19th. This meeting served as a training session, where we welcomed five new members and started to prepare for the massive number of course modifications to add DE Addenda. Our first queue (for yesterday's meeting - September 2nd) had 63 course modifications! This semester will be a huge lift, but I think we have a committee full of dedicated faculty that will get the job done.

Please make sure your divisions are aware that any course that was taught online in Summer 2020 or Fall 2020 must be modified to add a DE addendum by December 30th. Additionally, if you are wanting to offer a course in Spring 2021 that does not currently have a DE addendum, that will need to be modified and approved this fall as well.
