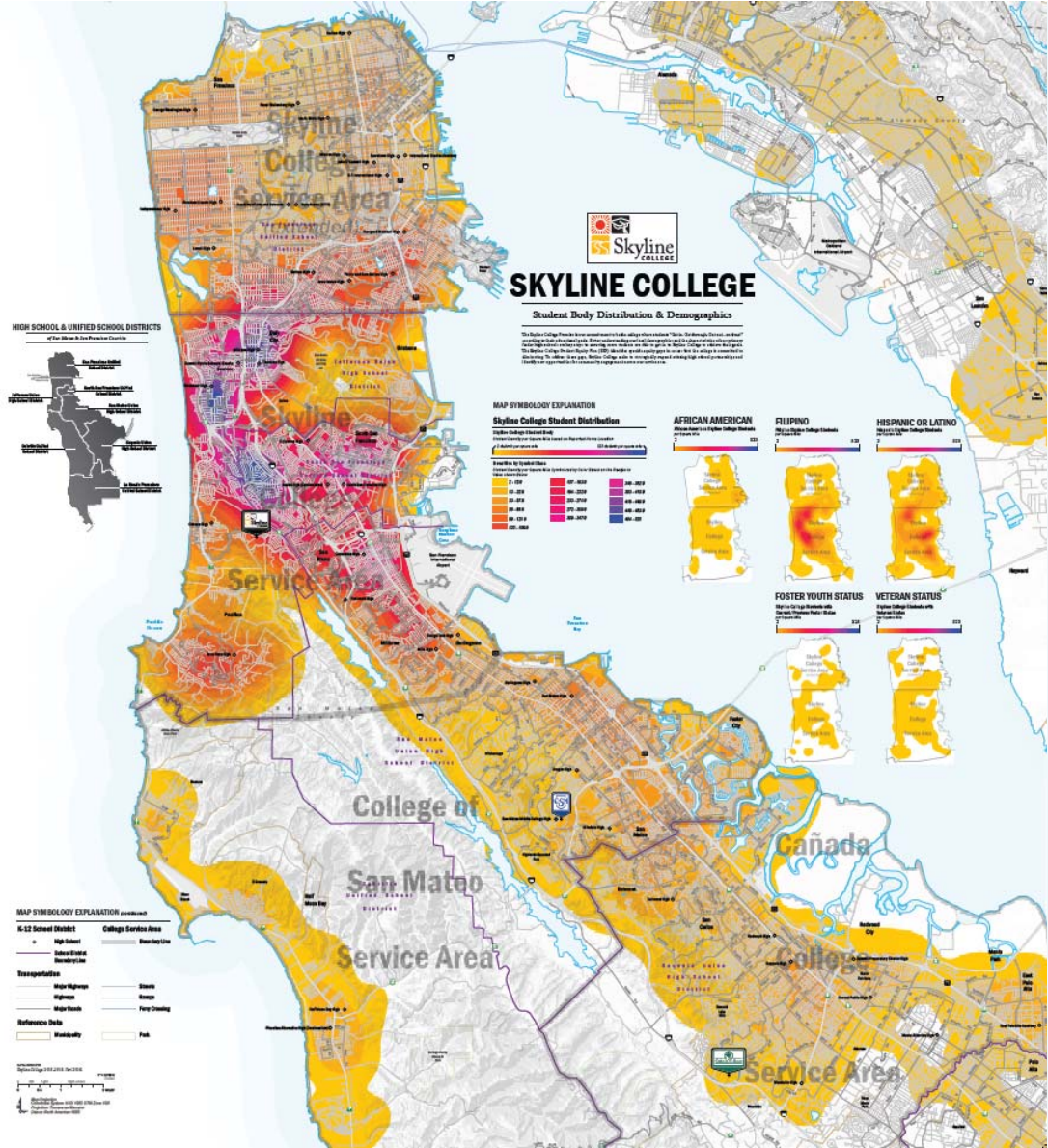

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Every fall semester, approximately 2,500 students experience Skyline College for the first time.

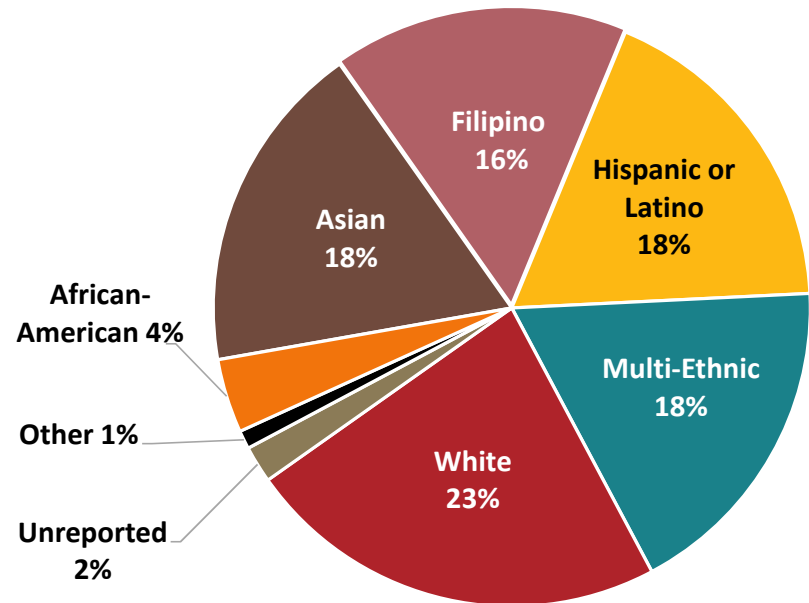
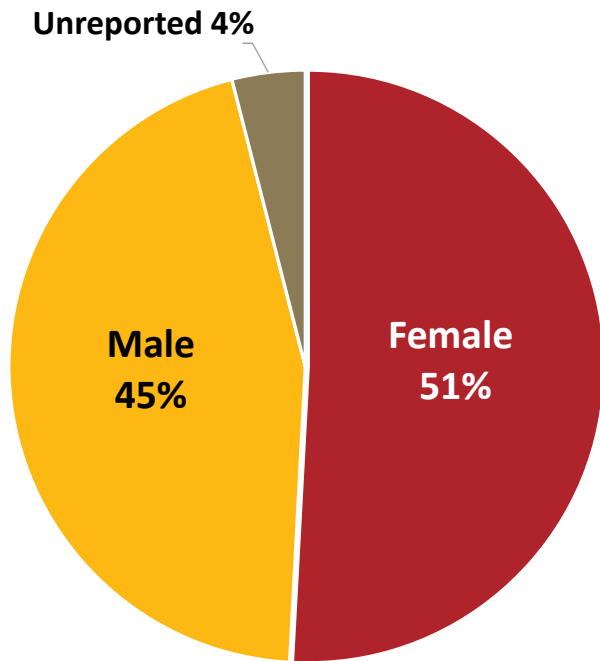
This represents one quarter of all students.

By the following spring semester, a little over half return.



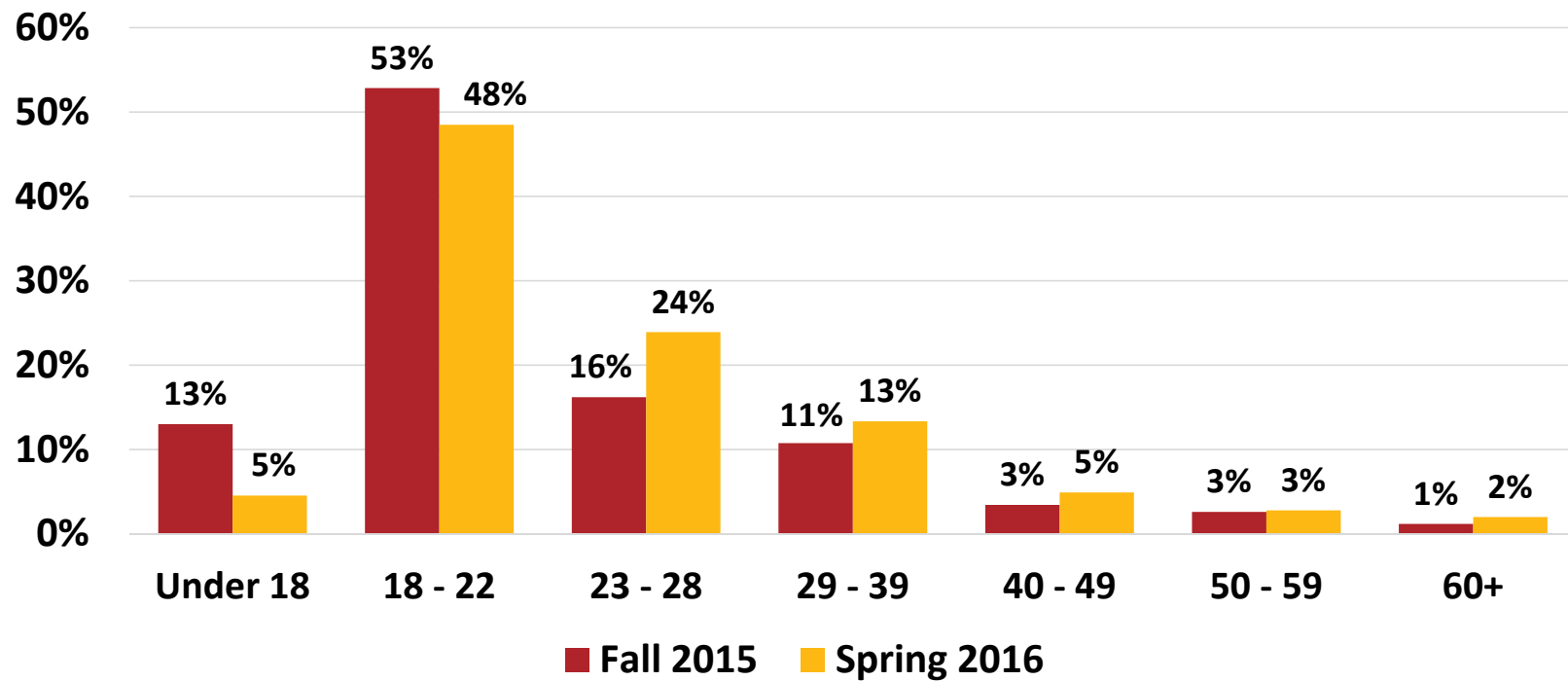

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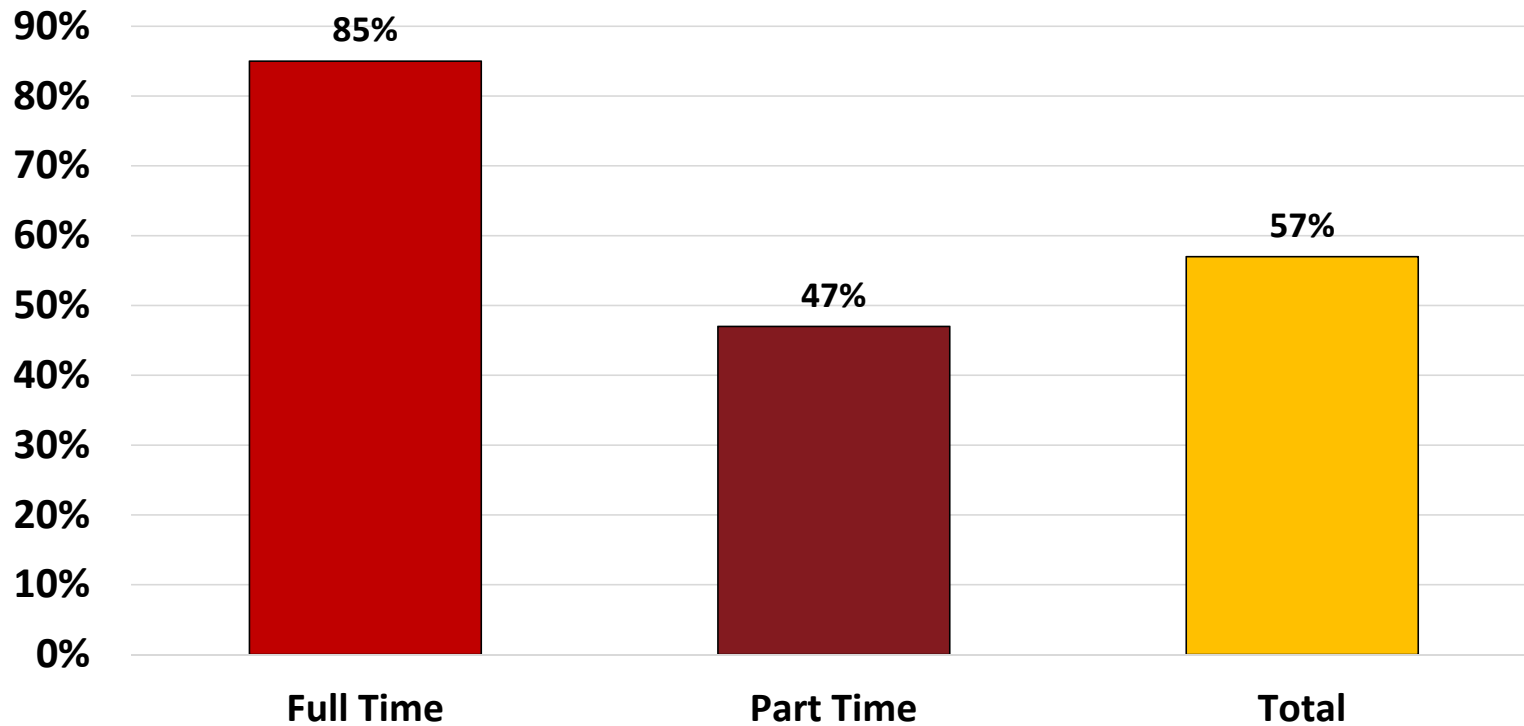

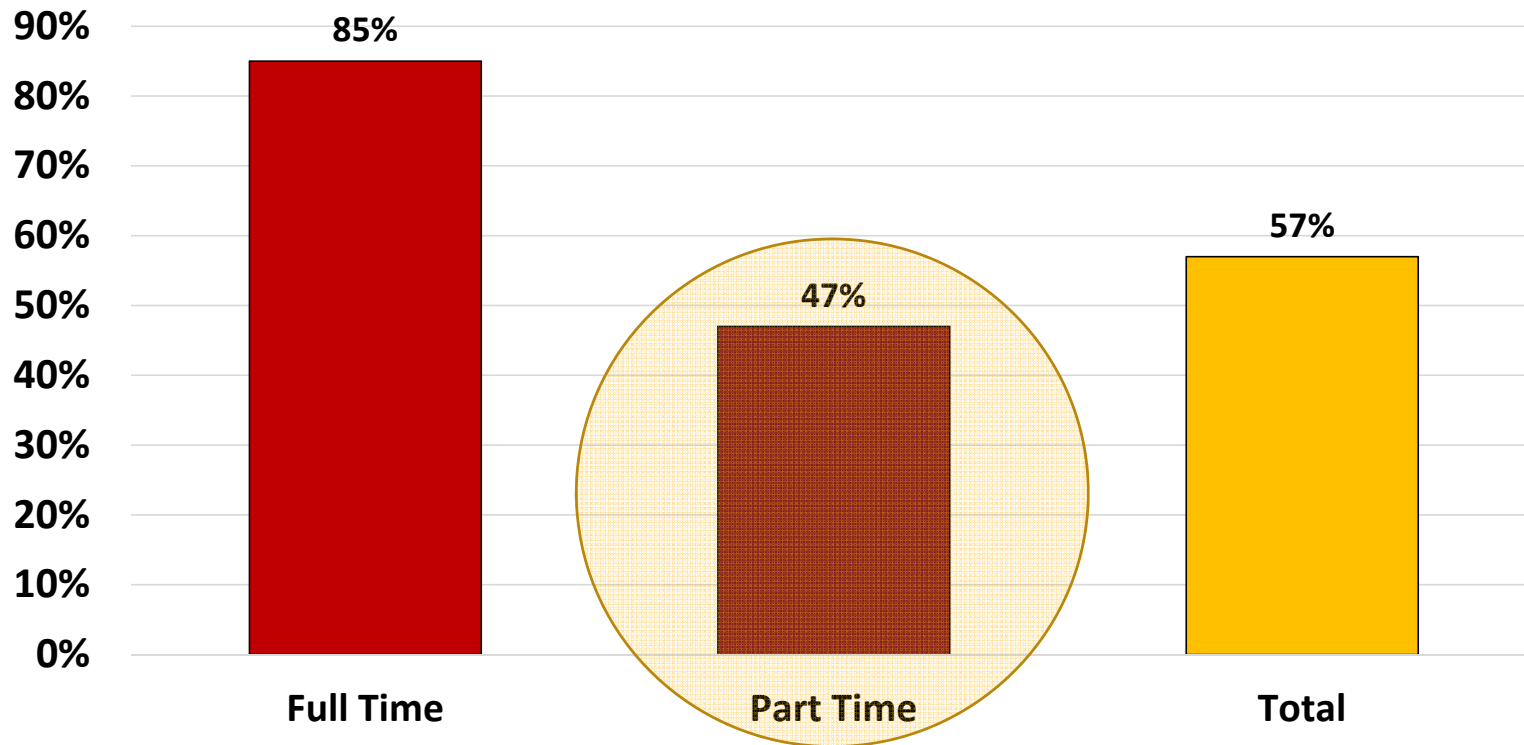

Pacific Islander Students:	53.8%

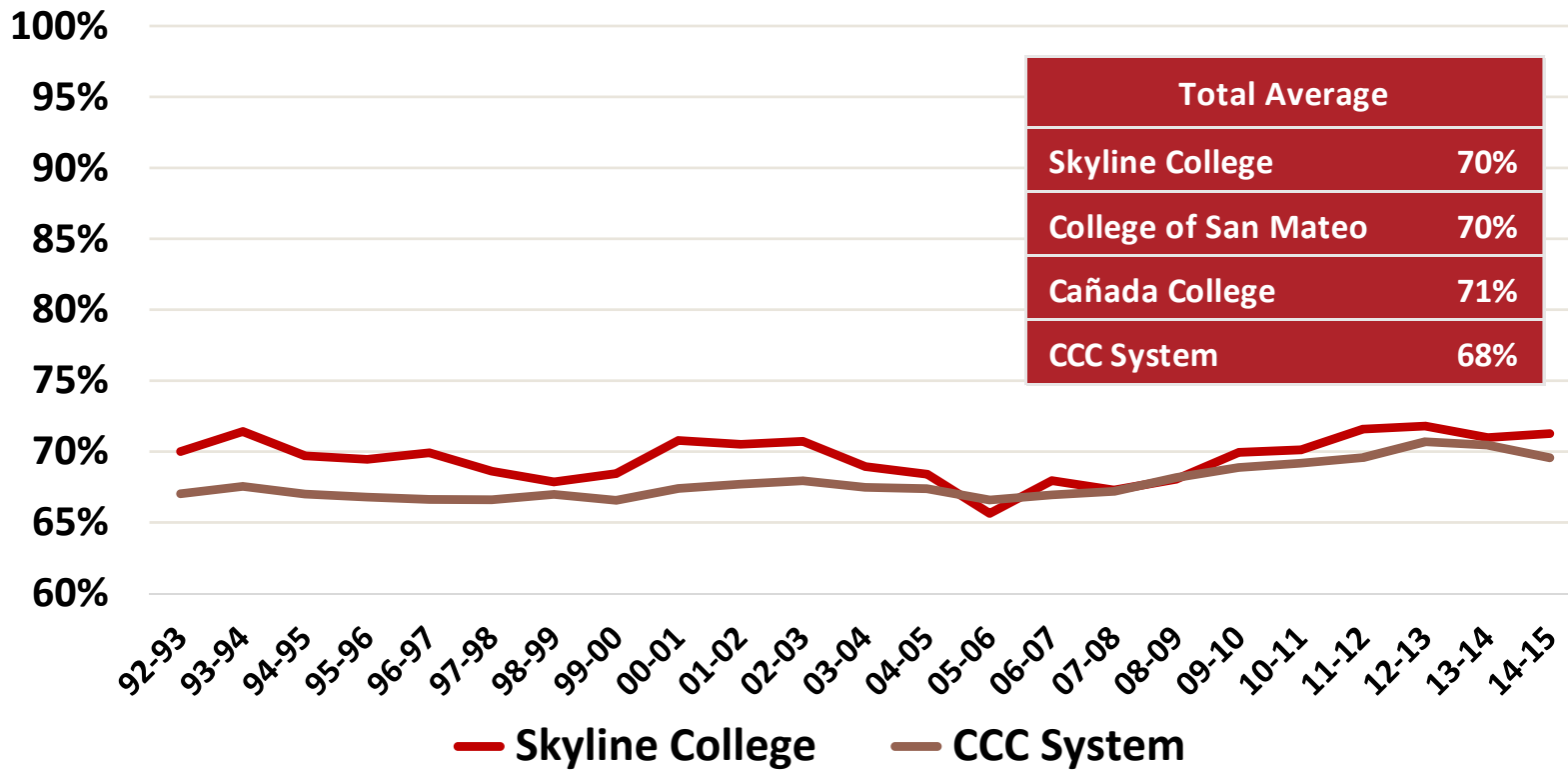
