ACHIEVEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

The program has grown substantially from 2016 to 2021, nearly doubling at an overall 77% increase in unduplicated enrollment. We believe the increase is due to enhanced course offerings since the program's inception in 2016, along with recruitment and engagement activities around the Engineering and Technology Scholars (ETS) learning community. The program is now further supported with the college's recent hire of a full-time Computer Science faculty.

Success rates for all courses are above or statistically coincident with the college average over the CPR period. Aggregate success rates for both female (78%) and male (79%) students exceed the college averages, respectively.

Achievement Highlights

- EOPS is intentionally serving Skyline College's identified disproportionately impacted student populations based on the College's Student Equity Plan.
- **Persistence:** EOPS students are persisting from one academic year to the next at a higher rate than the college's comparison group.
- Academic Standing: EOPS students have higher rates of maintaining a GPA of 2.0 or higher and also have higher course success rates each semester.
- Educational Goal Achievement: EOPS students have a higher 3-year combined degree/certificate completion rate than the college's comparison group.
- **Transfer Rate:** 22% of EOPS students have transferred within the last CPR time frame with majority of that percentage transferring within 3 years.

Respiratory Care Programs (Associate & Baccalaureate Degree Pathways)

The program offers an Associates of Science Degree in Respiratory Care which allows a graduate to become a licensed Certified Respiratory Therapist and also affords the opportunity to attain a higher level of credentialing (Registered Respiratory Therapist) as well.

Students who complete the Respiratory Care Program at Skyline College will be eligible to take the **NBRC Examination** and, upon passing, must apply for a professional **Respiratory Care Practitioner** license through the state of CA. Completing these requirements are a necessary step in obtaining employment. <u>https://skylinecollege.edu/respiratorycare/</u>

Skyline College offers a 4-year **Baccalaureate Degree in Respiratory Care.** The Bachelor's Degree offers students a greater ability to advance to management and leadership roles within the profession, to become advanced caregivers, to conduct health related research, and to become educators in the field.
