President's Remarks

- The Creative Arts Complex construction has been delayed by about 6 months.
- Environmental Sciences building will be opening Fall 2019.
- The Accelerated Study in Associate Programs (ASAP) model replication launched this semester Fall 2018. Second school in the nation and first for California to implement the ASAP model replication.
- Launched Meta Majors and Guided Pathways this Fall 2018.
- Equity Summit being held Friday, November 2nd in the College Theater.
- 2019 is our 50th Anniversary beginning Fall 2019-Spring 2020.
- Accreditation Site Visit will be held Fall 2019. The President's Council will be asked to participate in the process.

Success Summit Recap

- 136 registered and 120 attended the event.

- Ron Derenzi made a motion that the President's Council agrees to raise \$250,000 for the Skyline College Promise Scholars Program and President's Innovation Fund by June 2019. Of the \$250,000, the President's Council will raise at least 50%, or more of the funds.

Promise Scholars Program Presentation

- Ellen Murray, Director of Promise Scholars Program, updated the President's Council of the Skyline College Promise Scholars Program.
- Fall 2018, 507 students are enrolled in the Skyline College Promise Scholars Program.
- Comprehensive Student Support Program.
- Intended to fulfill the Skyline College Promise Program "to get in get through and graduate on time".
- Students to commit to full time enrollment, 12 units or more.
- Financial support through financial aid is applied first as it is a last dollar scholarship.
- Book support is through our bookstore where they purchase books on credit to cover book costs.
- Transportation support. Students receive a clipper card or gas cards for their transportation. As long as they work with their counselor and engage with the program, they will receive these cards monthly.
- Required counseling support.
- 150 to 1 ratio with Counseling and students.
- Career and professional development support is part of the program for the students.
- Academic support is available through the Promise Scholars Summer Institute. This for the student to get prepared for college level courses in Math and English.
- Of the 507 students enrolled in the Promise Scholars Program Fall 2017, 30 students are non-traditional students.
- College San Mateo and Cañada started their Promise Program Fall 2018.
- Two year funding is now available for all 507 students. The focus of the program is completion.
- AA degree will guarantee transfer to CSU.
- Cañada College has 350 Promise students.
- CSM, 478 Promise students.
