

# Gold, Gods, & Glory: The Global Dynamics of Power—the last in a series of three presentations

Last night I had the pleasure of attending the third in this serious of programs on global issues that affect us all. It was funded by the President's Innovation Fund and sponsored by Phi Theta Kappa, under the leadership of Christine Case. Amali Tower presented "Bridge 2 Peace: The Children of Sri Lanka." Bridge2Peace is a non-profit, non-governmental, organization operating in the United States and Sri Lanka. The mission of Bridge2Peace is to empower the children of emerging countries and their families so they will become informed resourceful self-reliant leaders able to shape a peaceful world for themselves, and those around them. Amali has been awarded the California State Award from the California League of Colleges for her humanitarian work and efforts with Bridge2Peace. She is presently working with The International Rescue Committee, providing relief to global refugees, political asylees, and victims of trafficking and torture who have been resettled in the Los Angeles region.

### Phi Theta Kappa All California Academic Team winners from Skyline

Two Skyline College students were recently selected for the 2007 Phi Theta Kappa All-California Academic Team: Javier Giron and Emi Matsuura. The All-USA Academic Team program annually recognizes 60 outstanding two-year college students. Phi Theta Kappa, *USA TODAY*, and the American Association of Community Colleges sponsor the All-USA Academic Team program annually. To be eligible, a student must post a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA and be eligible to graduate with an associate's degree.
