Q&A

Senator Reyes: Asked for clarification on the “Words as Production of Art” section, specifically whether the requirement is 70 words per piece or 700 total.

- Response: The requirement is 70 words per piece across 10 pieces, totaling approximately 700 words overall.

Senator Presto: Asked whether meals are included during the trip and how they are funded.

- Response(Alvin): Meal coverage depends on the trip schedule. Some meals may be included, but this is still being finalized. Students may be responsible for meals not covered.

: Asked whether the art exhibit will return to Associated Students of Skyline College (ASSC) or go to the department.

- Response: This is a good question and will need further clarification.

President(William): Asked whether the requested budget covers only the student or both the student and professor.

- Response: The budget primarily covers the student. The professor is seeking separate funding through professional development funds.

2. Chancellor Melissa Moreno (5-10mins)

- Chancellor Moreno provided a brief check-in. She acknowledged arriving late and shared her intention to return at the start of the fall term (August or September). Recognizing that students are currently preparing for finals and commencement, the Chancellor emphasized her availability to support students and invited any questions, concerns, or feedback from

the council. She reaffirmed her commitment to supporting students and expressed that serving and advocating for students is a central part of her role.

Q&A

Senator Bautista: Asked what have they heard that the students need?

- Response: Chancellor Moreno shared an update on a recent student housing groundbreaking event held at CSM, describing it as a meaningful and exciting milestone for the district. The project marks the beginning of district-wide student housing, with the first site located at the College of San Mateo campus and open to students from all campuses. Plans include a potential shuttle system to support access for students commuting from other colleges, such as Skyline.
- Chancellor Moreno emphasized that housing insecurity remains a significant concern, noting that some students face challenges such as couch surfing or living in their cars. They expressed optimism that this project is a strong step toward addressing those needs. The housing development is funded through state support, with a total cost of approximately \$87 million, and will provide 316 beds. While this is a positive start, the Chancellor acknowledged that it will not fully meet the needs of the approximately 1,100 students across the district currently experiencing housing insecurity, and highlighted this as an ongoing priority.

VP(Jarred): Asked a follow-up question regarding the proposed shuttle service, specifically whether it would be limited to students living in the housing or available to all district students

- Response: Chancellor Moreno responded that she did not have a definitive answer at this time and would follow up in the fall.
- She shared that the current plan is for student housing rent to remain well below market rates (approximately \$500–\$1,000 per month, depending on unit size), with that revenue supporting services such as counseling and a food pantry. She noted that a shuttle is anticipated to be part of the housing program and expressed the understanding that it would likely be available to all students, though this has not yet been confirmed.

Senator Presto: Asked whether the proposed shuttle would help unify transportation across all three campuses or be limited primarily to the housing site.

- Response: Chancellor Moreno responded that student travel patterns already involve moving between campuses, and acknowledged that transportation access has been an ongoing challenge, noting that the campuses are not easily accessible.
- She shared that the district has been working with SamTrans for several years to improve transit routes, but progress has been slow. She also emphasized that a district-wide shuttle system is needed regardless of the housing project; however, the addition of student housing may help fund and support expanded shuttle services, as transportation costs are significant.

: Asked about the types of amenities and services that would be available in the student housing, including access to hygiene facilities and community spaces.

- Response: Chancellor Moreno responded that while final details are still being confirmed, the housing is built to be more than just living space.
- She shared that the ground floor is planned as a student community area, which will include integrated support services similar to those offered on campus, along with study and lounge spaces for student use. The housing will feature multiple room configurations, including more affordable, communal-style units with shared kitchens, as well as more private units with individual kitchens or kitchenettes. She also noted that on-site laundry facilities are expected, though they would need to confirm final plans. Overall, the housing is intended to provide a supportive, fully integrated living and learning environment for students.
