	Ricardo brought up challenge that there are no student-facing training materials for Panopto. He is working with Chris Smith to produce student-facing trainings – also produce clearer documentation for faculty.

DISCUSSION	VRC is now up and running. CTTL will start moving all PD signups onto the VRC platform. Many benefits to this, including transcripts for all PD sessions attended.			
	Ricardo demonstrated accessing VRC via the OneLogin page and navigating to Learner Home. This is where CTTL will highlight trainings at Skyline. PD events are also listed on the Events Center.			
	Ricardo emphasized needing to register for events – but Tom shared his screen and demonstrated how it is not clear how to register for events. It turns out that one needs to click "Request," then "Add to Roster" to sign up for events. If you are on presenter list, you see "View Roster" (this lets you manage attendance).

DISCUSSION	Rolin lead discussion. We need to make tech upgrades to classrooms and other spaces to enable use of Zoom simulcasting In your specific role, what will you need technologywise to bridge your work between face-to-face and online? What do we need in terms of policy/guidance/expectations re. online vs. face-to-Face? Tom brought up that he needs high-speed broadband upload speeds. Also, remote control for office computers (which has been disabled for security reasons). Rolin noted this, and also mentioned that on-campus Internet access also needs to be considered. May need to look at increasing bandwidth. Paul observed that multiple webcams are necessary for hard-to-convert courses; Tom brought up doc cams. Tammy mentioned ring lights — especially important in cosmotology. Rolin shared that they are looking at "work-at-home" package for instructors. What types tech do instructors need? Chris suggested putting together a "recommended equipment" list for instructors.
